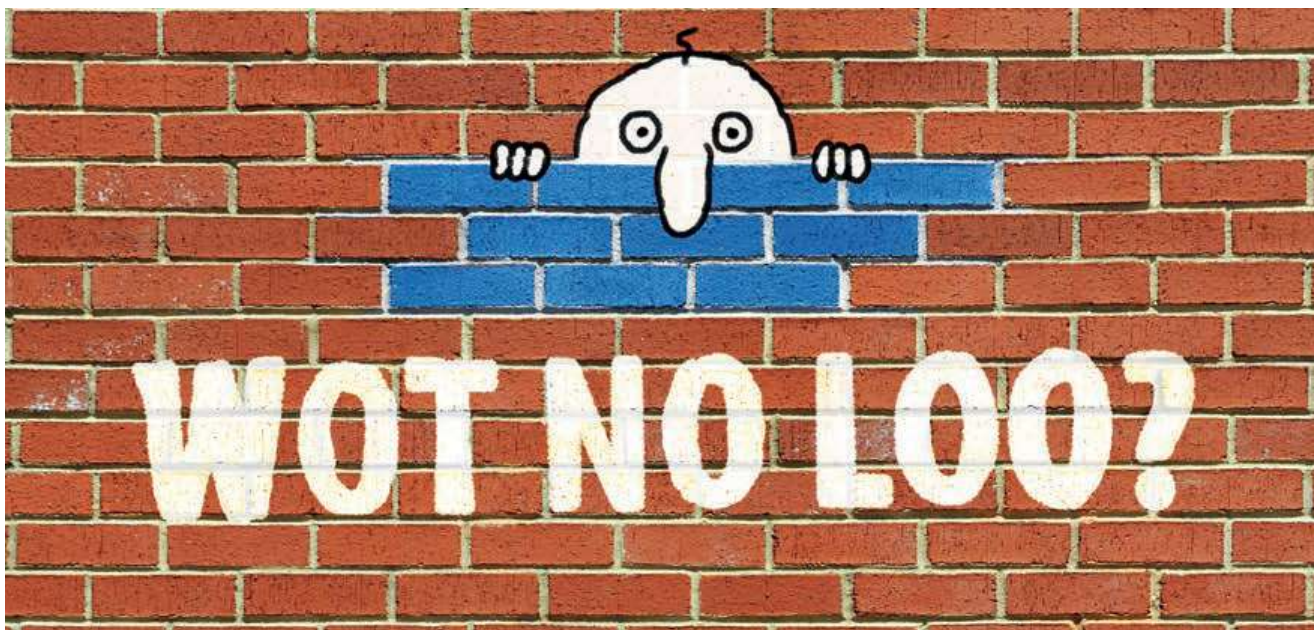

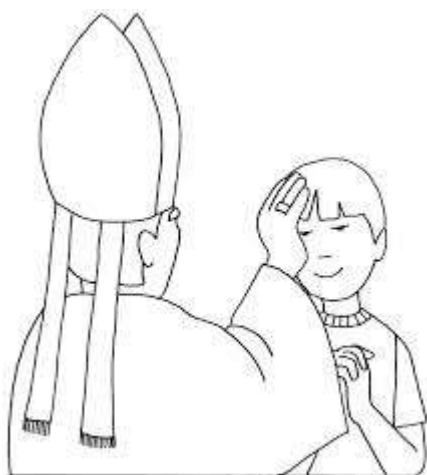

Lent Jars in aid of Toilet Twinning

Thank you for your generous contributions to this year's Lent jars Appeal. The total amount contributed by Bubbenhall and Ryton was £289.75, of which £180 was Gift-Aided. The charity will be able to collect a repayment from the Government for the Gift-aided donations, so the total benefit to Toilet Twinning will be £334.75, which will allow one or more communities in Africa or Asia to install simple but hygienic sanitary arrangements. In due course we should be sent details, perhaps with photos, of the specific loos that our donations have made it possible to install.

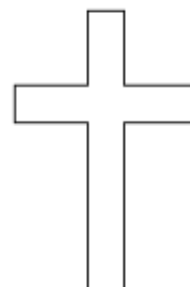

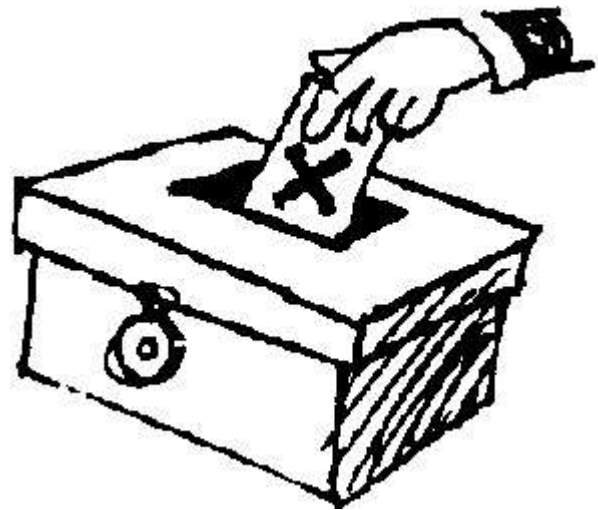

Thought for the month: from our Rector, the Revd. David Wintle.

As I write, it's just over a year since the UK voted to leave the European Union, and between two and three weeks since the general election, and at last we have an agreement between two political parties which suggests that we might have a viable government. But how long will it last? By the time you read this, things may have changed and what I have written may be out of date. What to make of the recent election result? Many of those who are anxious for the future have throughout the last half-century or so put their trust in human institutions, world leaders, governments and financial markets, and in election terms that has tended to result in stable, middle-of-the-road political parties forming stable, middle-of-the road governments.



But that trust in institutions seems to be wavering. The gap between the mainstream parties is wider than it has been for many years, and at the same time it would seem that both the experts and those in positions of power and influence don't seem to know how the UK is going to extract itself from the European Union, how long it will take, what it will mean for those who end up on the inside or the outside, who will be richer and who will be poorer - or at least they say they know, but for every apparently informed person with an opinion there is another apparently informed person with the opposite opinion. Will it be a hard or a soft Brexit and what exactly does that mean anyway? All we know is that Brexit means Brexit.

Institutions will come and go, governments will come and go, treaties will come and go, and world leaders will come and go, sometimes with alarming speed and leaving not much of a trace behind. For example: what's David Cameron up to at the moment?

And the LORD, He is the One
who goes before you. He will be
with you, He will not leave you
nor forsake you; do not fear
nor be dismayed
~Deuteronomy 31:8



I don't know what the future holds, but I do know who holds the future, and I know where I'm putting my trust – not in human institutions, or world leaders, or governments, or financial markets: “It is the Lord who goes before you. He will be with you; he will not leave you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed.” (Deuteronomy 31.8). Unlike governments, God really is strong and stable, although there are no guarantees of financial security or political stability: God offers us a different kind of stability and security, not the sort that we seek through the ballot box. Instead God offers us His peace: “Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives.

Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid”. (John 14.27).
