PARISH COUNCIL

Development - "Old House Farm" Site The District Council has now approved the naming of the road from Spring Hill to the A445 as "Pit Hill", and the cul-de-sac access road serving this development as "Darfield Court".

A445 The Parish Council has been in touch with the various departments concerned with matters affecting the A445 and its impact on Bubbenhall.

(a) Speed Limit As a result of representations made, the Parish Council asked the County Planning & Transportation Department to impose a speed limit on that stretch of the A445 from "Waverley Edge" past the Bubbenhall C.E. School to the Ryton Landfill site. To this request was added the pressure from the School Parent Support Group for the re-introduction of the school crossing patrol with flashing warning lights installed at the appropriate points on either side of the school. A reply has been received from that Department as follows:-

"Your request for a speed limit has been investigated. I am sure the Parish Council is aware that there are strict criteria laid down by the Department of Transport which must be complied with before a speed limit can be considered and these criteria concern the density of housing, nature of the road, injury, accidents and speed and etc. This length of road fails to satisfy these requirements on a number of points and could not justify a speed limit. I can understand your concern, especially with regard to school children and with this in mind an inquiry is being carried out by this Department's Road Safety Group with regard to crossing patrols and warning lights. We will also consider the effectiveness of larger "Children Warning" signs and "Slow" markings on the road. I hope that this might ease your concern somewhat".

The Parish Council can now only wait for the further comments from the County Planning & Transportation Department.

(b) "Concealed Entrance" signs - Waverley Edge The Parish Council approached the Planning & Transportation Department with regard to providing "Concealed Entrance" signs on either side of "Waverley Edge". This request has been turned down as there is no sign which can be erected indicating a "Concealed Entrance".

(c) The footway from Weston Lane has now been extended to join the entrance to Waverley Edge.

(d) The Parish Council has also taken up with the Planning & Transportation Department the danger arising from loose stones from the entrance to Waverley Edge being brought out onto the A445 and then being thrown up by traffic passing at high speeds.
