PARISH COUNCIL.

Ryton Landfill Site.

The Parish Council has been involved in discussion with the Warwickshire County Council regarding proposals for the restoration of the landfill site to a Country Park, encompassing the existing picnic area. The site runs from Pagets Lane to and including the lake, and is proposed to be laid out for the enjoyment of the general public. The Parish Council has raised an objection to the proposal to relocate the main entrance nearer to Bubbenhall at the bottom of the dip in the A.445, on road safety grounds, and has also objected to the imposition of a car parking charge for residents of Bubbenhall, suggesting that free permits be issued in this respect. There is also a proposal to use the landfill gas for the production of electricity, involving the construction of a generator house on site. The Parish Council has made representations with regard to the siting of the generator house and the question of a noise nuisance on the bungalow adjacent. Two site visits have been made and the matter is now with the County Council's Planning Committee for decision.

Extraction of Sand and Gravel.

There is little additional information to report on this matter.

Police Priorities.

The Parish Council was consulted with regard to police priorities and has replied that a Community Beat Officer should be available at all times in rural areas to answer calls, and that rural areas should receive the same attention and priority as urban areas.

Recreation Ground.

The Parish Council has raised no objection to the installation of lighting on the end of the Village Hall furthest from the car park and pointing away from dwellings, to enable the Malt Shovel Football Club to train at night.

National Tree Week.

The Parish Council has asked the District Council for a number of trees for planting in the village, as part of National Tree Week.
