

Lemon Drizzle Simnel Slices

Cook Time: 40 mins Cuts into 16 slices

Ingredients

250g Softened butter 250g Golden caster sugar, plus 50g for topping 2 large lemons, zested and juiced 3 large eggs 200g plain flour 100g ground almonds 2.5 tsp baking powder 50ml milk 100g mixed dried fruit 300g marzipan, chilled 50g icing sugar 11 Chocolate mini eggs as an alternative

- 1. Heat oven to 180/160C fan/gas 4. Oil & line a 20cm x 30cm baking tin with baking parchment
- 2. Beat the butter & sugar with most of the lemon zest until pale & fluffy. Add the eggs one at a time, mixing constantly, then add flour, almonds & baking powder. Keep mixing until you have a smooth batter then stir in milk & dried fruit.
- 3. Put half of the mixture into the tin & level. Coarsely grate half the marzipan onto the mixture to create an even layer then cover with the remaining mixture. Level the top and bake for 35-40 mins. Test with a skewer after this time, if wet mixture clings to skewer bake for a further 5 mins.
- 4. Mix the remaining caster sugar with a quarter of the lemon juice and drizzle over the warm cake. Leave the cake to cool in the tin.
- 5. Mix icing sugar with enough lemon juice to make a drizzly icing @ 2-3 tsp should be enough. Divide the rest of the marzipan into 11 even lumps and roll into balls. Drizzle the icing over the cake, top with the marzipan balls and sprinkle with the remaining lemon zest. (You can replace the marzipan balls for chocolate mini eggs.



Ryton Pools Country Park

Easter Comes Early!

Generally speaking it is the Easter that demarks holidavs the transition from the practical work of winter, into the more visitorfocussed summer season. This year however, the remarkable early spring weather brought this forward into the February half Both the park and our term. events were busier than we have ever known it so early in the year, and it was a joy to see.

Dunsmore Living Landscape Project

We are delighted with the new bushcraft shelter that has been installed in Children's Wood. It has already seen plenty of action over the holidays with several campfire and dens events taking place. It was enthusiastically received by the children, and adds an exciting focal point for the events. An unexpected boon for us rangers is the great acoustic qualities of the shelter that give a bit of added resonance to our voices! To finish it off we will be adding some screening to the sides and a stone fire pit.



Wildlife is also a key component of the Dunsmore Project and this spring we have 6000 trees to plant in the park to create one mile of new and enhanced hedgerows in the park. 

Grow Your Own

Well, what will the growing conditions be this year? So far we have avoided snow and the temperatures in February were balmy (but not good for garlic, which likes a cold snap). Now is the time though for sowing brassicas and leeks, preferably with some protection such as a cold frame or greenhouse. Easter is late this year but is a useful marker of when to start off sweetcorn, French beans and courgettes, again best under cover or for the latter in a propagator. Hopefully we won't have to do so much watering this year.

Although not really suitable for showing at the Fruit, Flower and Produce show in September there are cut and come again plants that are very good for eating and can look quite decorative in a flower bed. Lettuce such as Red Salad Bowl is a common one, but others to try are **Rainbow Chard**, with its multicoloured stems, and Borecole Cavolo Nero, which has become quite fashionable in cooking.

Warwickshire Trading Standards has received reports that fraudsters are making unexpected (cold) phone calls to Warwickshire residents, claiming that they are calling from the resident's local district or borough council offices and stating that the



Tickets £10 ~ Profits to Air Ambulance Contact: Christine Foster 07968 437013 resident is owed a refund on their council tax. The fraudster then asks for the resident's debit or credit card details, so that the 'refund' can be paid on to the card or into their account.

Trading Standards Officers suspect that these bogus phone calls are being made now as new council tax bills for 2019/20 will shortly be sent to residents. **NEVER** provide your bank or debit/credit card details to any cold callers, no matter who they claim to be. **You could have money stolen from your bank account**. If you think a call is genuine, phone the organisation back using a publicly advertised telephone number. Use a different phone or wait a few minutes to ensure the previous caller has hung up.

Also be aware of a 'security company scam' operating in this area where a telephone call is received by householders. The caller purports to be from a Security Company and may state that they are endorsed by Warwickshire Police and/or West Midlands Police. The caller then seeks to make an appointment with the householder to review security at the householder's property.

Householders are advised that Warwickshire Police, in common with all other police forces, **DO NOT** endorse any companies, including so-called security companies.

It is believed these calls are a scam and householders are advised NOT to provide any personal details or agree to any appointments. Simply end the telephone call.
