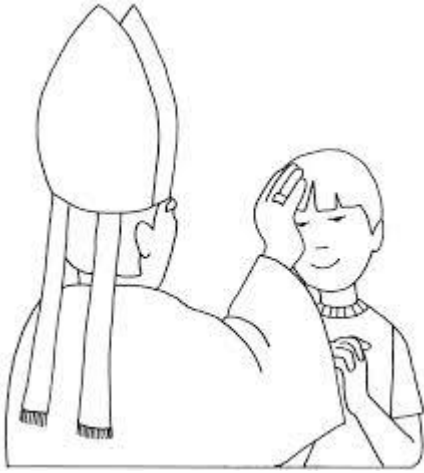

Our churchyard is looking immaculate thanks to the efforts of the kind volunteers who give generously of their time and labour to keep it that way. Thank you all very much indeed.

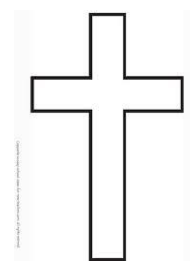

Thought for the month: from our Rector, the Revd. David Wintle.



"Why is an A or B better than a C or D?
Aren't all letters equal in the eyes of God?"

The end of the school year will soon be upon us, and, as well as the summer holidays, parents and children have to look forward to the end of year school report.

Of course it doesn't end with school. Those of us who have a job will from time to time have to go through an appraisal or some sort of training with assessment at the end of it.

One of my appraisals was marked by computer, and confusingly told me that I was pretty good at all the various tasks that make up my job but no good at the job as a whole. What was I supposed to do with that?

What if God gave us a report card or an appraisal? How would we get on? God has told us what he wants of us:

“He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?” (Micah 6:8).

Do Justice: Justice is sadly lacking in many parts of the world. Can we do anything about that? Maybe we can do a little by buying fairly traded goods or making our feelings felt to our MP when our country lets us down. But what about justice on a personal level? Have I been upright in all my dealings? Have I filled in my tax forms honestly? When I see injustice happening around me, do I take a stand?

Love kindness: Have I been reaching out to people in need? Have I visited my ill or housebound neighbour? Did I ever get around to filling in that charity direct debit form? When I do give, to charity or to the church, do I take account of how good God has been to me? Do I allow my work or my hobbies to get in the way of the care I should be giving to my family?

Walk humbly with your God: We all succumb to pride in our lives. When things go well, we think it must be because of something we did or said, and we are happy to accept the praise that comes our way. That's dangerous, because it makes us forget God. To be honest, I haven't known that many truly humble Christians. For most of us, walking humbly with your God only comes through experiencing those times when things don't go well at all.

What would your report card look like? Mine would definitely say things like “Could do better”, and “Doesn't pay attention in class”.

It's just as well for us, then, that God loves us and accepts us anyway, not because of anything that we can do for him, but entirely through what he has done for us. He sent his son Jesus to show us that no matter how horrible we are to each other and to him, God's love is the strongest thing there is, stronger even than death itself.

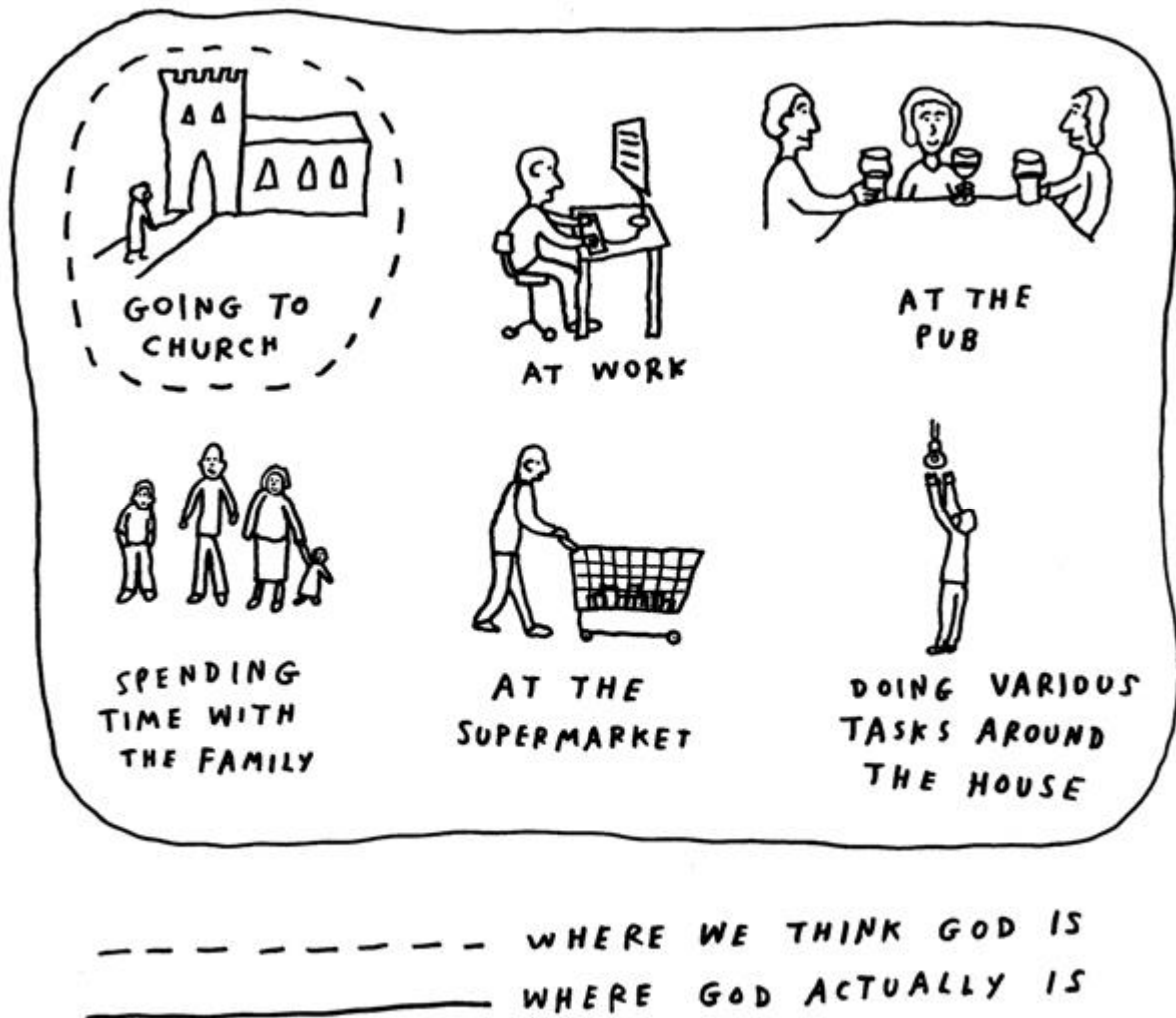
