Susan Sheen writes:



Churchyard Team: Thank you very much!



Thought for the month: Where's the piccolo?

Sir Michael Costa was a great orchestral conductor of the 19th Century. It is said that one day he was conducting a rehearsal in which a full orchestra was joined by a great choir.

About halfway through the session, with trumpets blaring, drums rolling, and violins singing their rich melody, the piccolo player muttered to himself, "What good am I doing? I might just as well not be playing. Nobody can hear me anyway."



So he kept the instrument to his mouth, but he made no sound. Within moments, the conductor cried, "Stop! Stop! Where's the piccolo?

What's happened to the piccolo?"

It was missed by the ear of the most important person of all.

We may sometimes feel like that piccolo player – that we don't have much to offer, that if we stopped whatever we do in life, no one would notice anyway.

Surrounded by people we think are more talented or more competent than us, we may feel insignificant and useless and we may be tempted in our weak moments just to settle back and let somebody else do the work. We reason that what we have to offer won't make much difference anyway.

Yet the Great Conductor notices, and needs us to complete his orchestral masterpiece! Each of us has something important to offer to serve God and our fellow human beings. Let's not forget the truth suggested by Jesus' use of five loaves and two small fish to feed a huge crowd. (John 6:1-14).

A Prayer: Lord, take whatever I have to offer and use it for your purposes. AMEN
