
Mr. Alan Swinscoe has for many years delivered the Church newsletter to parishioners who are not able to receive it by email or on-line.

A QUARTER PEAL AT ST GILES FOR THE QUEEN'S 90th BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS!

We are pleased to report that a Quarter Peal to celebrate the Queen's 90th birthday was successfully completed at St Giles, on Saturday 11th June 2016.

Nos. indicate the bell rung by that person -1 is the treble bell and no. 6 is the tenor.

Post ringing note: The Coventry Guild successfully completed their mammoth attempt which was to ring 90 quarter peals at 90 different towers. In fact, a total of 93 quarter peals were rung in 91 Guild towers within the Coventry Diocese!

In all, a total of 602 bells were rung, 557 bells were rung by 190 resident Guild members representing 55 Guild Towers. They were assisted by 31 more ringers from neighbouring Guilds, who rang the remaining 45 bells.




At choir practice we work hard- but each practice only lasts one hour! And we have a brilliant director! Come and join us for fun and fellowship as we work together to produce a good sound.

Children in church.



Although we do not at present have the resources to run regular services for children at Bubbenhall, we love having children in our churches, and there is **always provision for them at the 9.30 a.m. services at Ryton**.

All families with babies and children are sure of a warm welcome whenever they can join us. All Ryton Sunday morning services start **at 9.30 a.m.**, and the pattern is:

2nd Sunday in every month: Village Worship.

The most informal of all our services.

We start in the Church Centre (warm and welcoming) with workshop activities for children, and coffee, puzzles and chat for grown-ups to get to know one another.

At about 10.00 we move into church for a short and child-centred service.

There is no need to be there on the dot of 9.30- people drift in as soon as they can make it.

4th Sunday in every month: Family Service.

An all-age service of readings, songs and activities with everybody young and old in church together.

Children always participate in the readings/ drama sketches etc. and several people bring instruments to accompany the songs. (and any other musicians among you and your children would be very welcome to join them)

Tea/coffee and cake after the service in the Church Centre.

Ist and 3rd Sundays in every month: Parish Communion with Sunday School.

Tea/coffee and the chance to socialise after every service. Children start the service in church with their parents, and after the first hymn go out for Sunday School activities in the Church Centre, returning to receive a blessing at the time of Communion. Parents are welcome to accompany their little ones to Sunday School and stay with them if they lack confidence at first.

Families from Bubbenhall are especially welcome at all these services.

At these services, we also have a robed choir which includes older children (aged about 8 and upwards) and teenagers: anyone whose son/daughter likes singing might consider

Thought for the Month: Gratitude.



An American pastor tells this story: For some time a church member has provided me with a rose buttonhole to pin on the lapel of my suit every Sunday. Because I always got a flower on Sunday morning, I really did not think much of it. It was a nice gesture that became routine. One Sunday, however, what I considered ordinary

became very special.

As I was leaving the church building, a young boy

approached and said, "Sir, what are you going to do with your flower?" At first I did not know what he was talking about, but then I understood. I said, "Do you mean this?" as I pointed to the rose pinned to my coat.

He said, "Yes sir. I would like it if you are just going to throw it away. I would like to give it to my granny. My mother and father got divorced last year. I was living with my mother, but she could not have me any more, so she sent me to live with my grandmother. She has been so good to me that I want to give that pretty flower to her for loving me."

When the little boy finished I could hardly speak. My eyes filled with tears and I knew I had been touched in the depths of my soul. I reached up and unpinned my flower. With the flower in my hand, I looked at the boy and said: "Son, that is the nicest thing I have ever heard, but you can't have this flower because it's not enough.

If you'll look in front of the pulpit, you'll see a big bouquet of flowers. Different families buy them for the church each week. Please take those flowers to your granny because she deserves the very best."

If I hadn't been touched enough already, he made one last statement and I will always cherish it. He said, "What a wonderful day! I asked for one flower but got a beautiful bouquet."

Lord God, you have given us more than we desire or deserve. Help us to be grateful for the kindness and love that other people show us, and for all the blessings that you have lavished upon us. AMEN

We offer books in both Large and Small print and also talking books on compact disc.




