The congregation at St. Leonard's Church was pleased to welcome Archdeacon Barry Dugmore to preside and preach at Parish Communion on June 16.

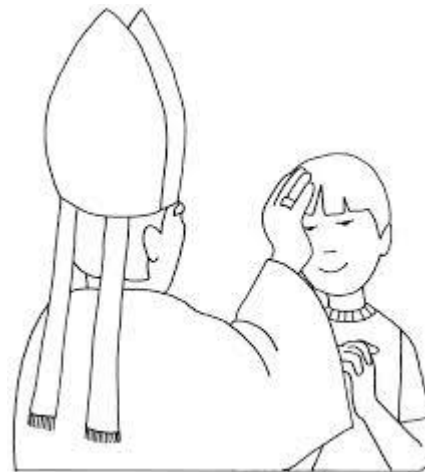

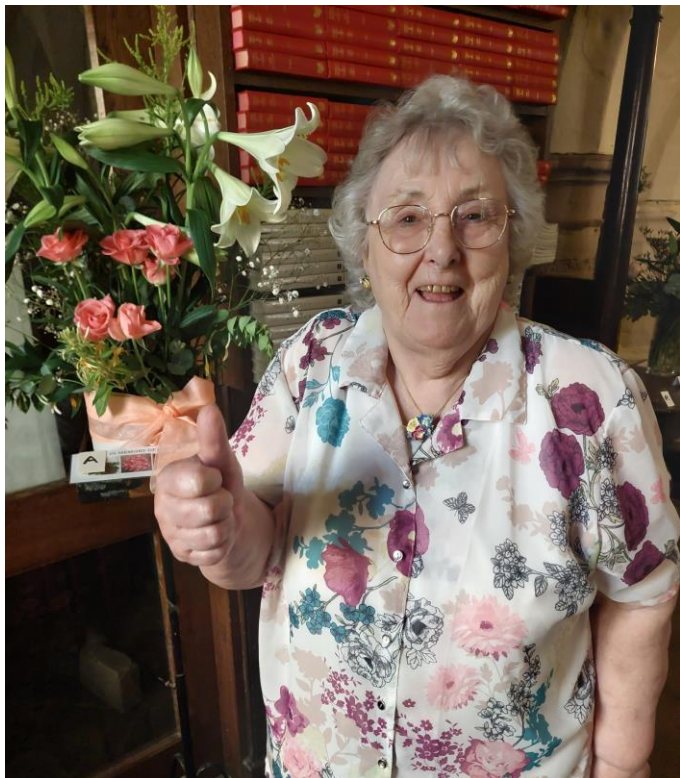

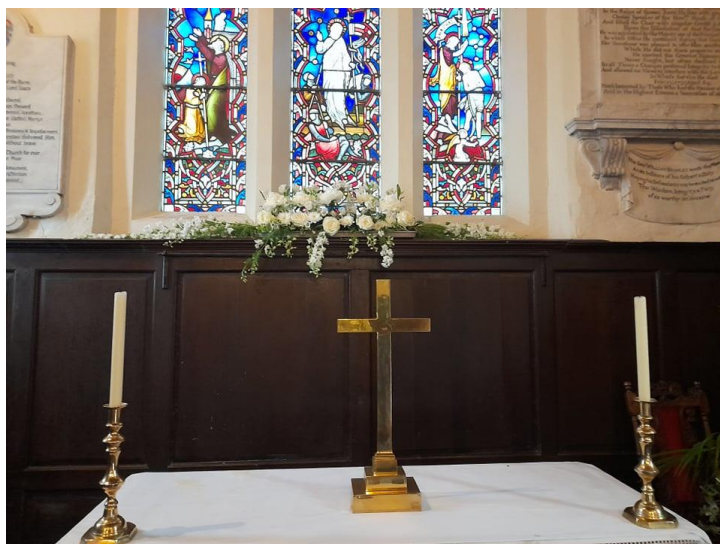

Our open Gardens and Flower Festival was a great success. There were about 12 gardens that opened each day at 12 midday. Jean Fawcett and her team of helpers served refreshments, (tea, coffee and cakes- the cakes were donated by the congregation and friends).

In church we opened at 1pm and had 109 visitors over the two days which was marvellous . The flower arrangements were donated by the clubs and committees of the village. There were so many I started to worry we would have no room for any more.

We have not received the final total collected, but is over £3,000, which will help a lot in running the church.

Thought for the Month: Holy Communion.

According to the Bible, the night before Jesus died, he had supper with his friends. When he gave thanks for the bread and wine which were a part of the meal, he said: "This bread is my Body. This wine is my Blood. Eat and drink them in memory of me."

And his followers have been doing just this down through the ages.

Some Christians emphasize the first statement:

"This is my Body, This is my Blood", and believe that, when the priest consecrates the bread and the wine at the service we call Holy Communion, the Lord's Supper, Eucharist or Mass, the bread and wine are changed and become the mystical body and blood of Jesus.

Others believe that Jesus did not intend his words to be taken so literally, and prefer to emphasise the second part of what he said. ("Do this in memory of me.")

For them, Holy Communion is simply a celebration when we come together to remember Jesus.



Because of the belief that there is at any rate, "something special" about the bread and wine after the priest has consecrated them, many churches have a special safe, in which some consecrated bread and wine are kept so that this special bread and wine can be taken to sick and dying parishioners. This safe is called an Aumbry. In our Benefice, Ryton and Baginton churches have aumbries but Bubbenhall does not.

A light burns continually in front of the aumbry, indicating its sacred contents even when no human being happens to be in church.

Many churches have moved from having a candle burning there, to having an electric bulb, which avoids the perceived fire risk of a naked flame.

So what is Holy Communion for you and me? How should we interpret it? Can we even start to understand it? Well, you could call it a puzzle, or a mystery- or a Sacrament.

And as far as we know, at the Last Supper, Jesus didn't say: "understand this."

He didn't even say: "Believe this."

He just said: "Do this."

So just do it.

And with open hands receive what Jesus chooses to give you.

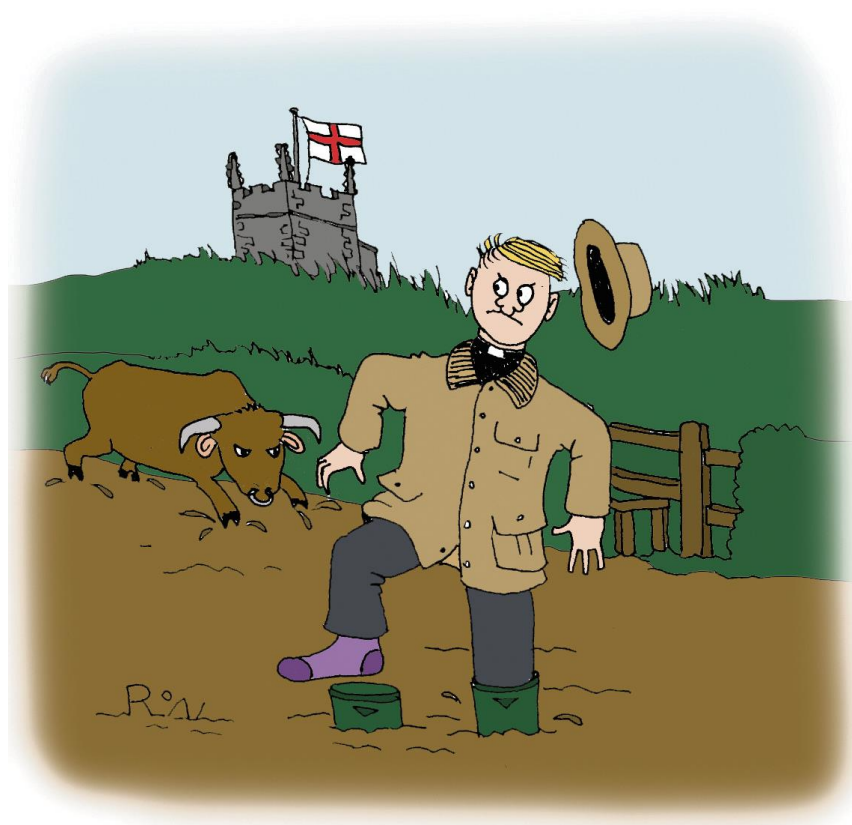
Wildflowers: The beauty all around us.
