### PARISH COUNCIL

"THE SPOUT", Spring Hill. Attention is drawn to the terms of a notice issued by the Environmental Health Department of the District Council stating that following poor results of chemical samples of the water from "The Spout", it is advised that this spring water should not be used for preparing baby feeds. In addition, if anyone is using large quantities of this spring water for consumption or in food preparation, they should consider treatment of the water to reduce the nitrate content before consumption.

VARIATION OF RECLAMATION WORKS CONSENT. The Parish Council is joining with Warwick District Council in formally objecting to the Secretary of State for the Environment against a temporary revision of existing consent conditions for the Bubbenhall station while constructional works took place to update and enhance the treatment processes. At a meeting of the District Council's Environmental Health Committee, information was made available that 100mg per litre of sewage would be discharged rather than the current 70mg, and that the Severn Trent Water Authority wished to make the 100mg per litre into a new legal limit for the Bubbenhall station.

The Parish Council has lodged the formal objection and supported Warwick District Council in its opposition to the proposed increased legal limits.

EXTRACTION OF SAND AND GRAVEL No additional information is available regarding the probable submission by Smiths Concrete Ltd of a planning application with regard to the extraction of sand and gravel from Glebe Farm, along the A445 between Weston Lane and Pagets Lane. No progress has, therefore, been made with regard to the proposed open representation evening at the Village Hall, at which the proposals could be explained.

PROPOSED CONVERSION OF BARNS, PIECE BARN FARM. It is understood that the District Council's Plans Sub-Committee has approved the conversion of these barns into three dwellings.

WESTON LANE The road signs agreed to be provided by the County Council have not yet been installed. The Parish Council has taken this matter up again.

PICNIC TABLE - RECREATION GROUND The picnic table has been vandalised for the second time, and this time it cost the Parish Council £26 to have it repaired. The play area here has been provided for all, and it is difficult to imagine why someone should find it necessary to damage any part of it.
