## Report from the Parish Council

### Security

Two incidents of cars being broken into have been reported. In both cases, items were taken from the back seats. The culprits who attacked the owner of Spring Hurst Cottage have been apprehended and await sentencing. There have been problems with the street lighting in Spring Hill and this has been reported.

### Planning Items

The following planning applications have been reviewed by the Council since the last newsletter:

- a) Planning permission has been granted for the erection of a side and rear two-storey and rear single storey extension on a property in Home Close.

- b) Planning permission was approved for a development on Bubbenhall Equestrian Centre.
- c) An application on internal and external alterations to Brandon House was reviewed and approved.
- d) An application for alterations to a property in Siskin Drive was approved.

Further discussions have taken place regarding the application for permission to allow the tipping of an additional layer of waste on top of the existing landfill. The Parish Council have objected to the application on the following grounds:

- 1) Duration of infill has been significant and an extension of a further 12 years is unacceptable.
- 2) Land profile following additional infill is unacceptable.
- 3) The drift of waste is not currently controlled.
- 4) There is a need to look at the original plan and watch for rodents and smell.
- 5) There is a need to be aware of the ornithological changes that have taken place.

The application was discussed at the District Council meeting on 13<sup>th</sup> June and the Parish Council sent a representative to voice our objections.

## "Public Inquiry into Enforcement Notice Appeal"

Following unauthorised commencement of passenger operations by Thomsonfly from Coventry Airport on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2004, Warwick District Council took enforcement action against the 'interim passenger facility' (IPF) being used to serve the operation of passenger flights. This development had not been the subject of a planning application. Bubbenhall Parish Council has lent its

support to 'The Community Group' a collective of over 30 parish and town councils along with Friends of the Earth and CAECA (Campaign against the expansion of Coventry Airport), who generally supported Warwick District Council in taking enforcement the action.

Following one of the longest enforcement inquiry hearings on record, the inspectors prepared a report and recommendation to the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Transport who determined the appeal.

In April 2006, the Secretary of State's decision was announced. It was confirmed that the airport had been in breach of planning control and that the IPF facility was not 'permitted development'.



However, the airport was granted retrospective planning permission for the IPF, but subject to significant operating restrictions, including:

- Cap on total number of passenger aircraft movements of 10,700/ year;
- Cap on passenger numbers, 0.98 million/year;
- A night time noise quota will be put into place, restricting total night time noise;
- Air quality monitoring;
- Various restrictions on flight times to restrict peak hour traffic generation;
- Car parking in Baginton not to be used for passengers;
- Vortex damage rectification/prevention scheme to be put in place;
- Various public transport improvements to be put in place;
- Cyclist/ pedestrian facilities to be improved;
- A formal noise complaints procedure to be adopted, to provide written responses to all complaints, and available for public inspection;
- Quiet operations subcommittee established to consider noise issues;
- Airport transport Forum established to consider access issues.

A timescale of 3 months from the date of the decision letter has been given to the airport to make progress on these issues, otherwise the 'development shall cease to be used'.

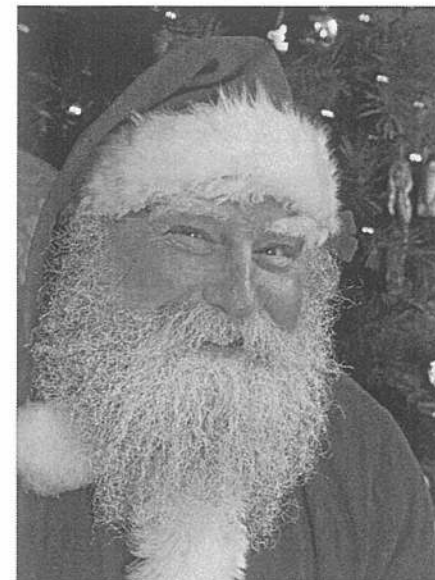

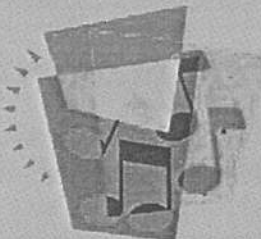

## Public Inquiry into Permanent Passenger Terminal

As well as appealing against the enforcement, the airport have submitted multiple planning applications for permanent passenger terminals and associated car parks.

An original application for a passenger terminal (2,935m<sup>2</sup>) and car park (680 spaces) was refused by WDC, and ultimately withdrawn by the airport. However it was replaced by one 3.5 times the size and with 5 times the car parking. (10,000m<sup>2</sup> building, 3,425 car parking spaces and apron extension of 20,000m<sup>2</sup>).

This planning application for a larger permanent passenger terminal was not determined by Warwick District Council and the appeal is being dealt with by the Planning Inspectorate. A Public Inquiry started on the 10<sup>th</sup> January 2006 at Leamington Town Hall. Bubbenhall PC once again gave its support to the 'Community Group' who objected to this application primarily on the grounds of the lack of need, noise, air quality, and traffic impacts. John Border spoke on behalf of Bubbenhall PC at the inquiry in February 2006. This Inquiry is still continuing, planned to run on to early July 2006.

At the current time it seems quite likely that planning permission will be granted, but subject to similar conditions to the IPF. There would be a further reduction of the night noise quota, to offset the increase in the movement and passenger limits. Full expansion may be restricted until proposed Tollbar End road improvements are put in place (see below).

## Consultation on Noise Preferential Routes / Standard Departure Routes

The airport has been forced to publish and consult on plans

showing its preferred departure routes, as it appears that they had modified their routes without any public consultation. These routes do not significantly affect the village, but do impact on other adjacent villages and north Leamington. This consultation ran to 9<sup>th</sup> June 2006.

## Closing the Technological Generation Gap

### The "Friendly Club" gets Techy!

With the aid of the Parish and County Councils, we have secured three computers for the use of Bubbenhall parishioners. The aim is to enable our more senior citizens to learn computer skills.



A group from "Bubbenhall Friendly Club" are the first to take up the challenge and have already successfully achieved the first two certificates - "Basic Computer Knowledge" and "First Stages in Word-Processing."



The lessons are held in the village hall but during gaps between series of lessons we plan that the computers will be available to go into the homes of those who have no computer of their own so that learning can be developed. One to one home support is then available. In the autumn we hope to start a new series of lessons on how use of the Internet. One of the current group's hopes is to keep up with their children and grandchildren and to be able to engage them in computer chat ! The vocabulary list is growing and they are already familiar with fonts, hard disks, memory sticks, megabytes, PDAs (personal digital assistant) and aligning text. In the autumn they will be surfing, browsing and blogging!

New classes will start in the autumn so if you want to join in the fun or to start the new Internet & e-mailing class contact Ruth Green. Classes can be adapted to your needs and requirements (subject to numbers). Classes are free except for the cost of village hall hire cost which is shared amongst the participants.

## Airport Consultative Committee

The airport reformed the Airport Consultative committee during 2004. Bubbenhall PC was refused a space on the committee, but John Border now has a seat.

Concern remains as to the usefulness of this committee while the chairman remains; Lord Snape, who appears fiercely pro-aviation. However information, such as data on flights and passengers is made available, and opportunities are given to ask questions of the airport's managers regarding activities. In each of the first two years of the Thomsonfly operation, 640,000 to 700,000 passengers have used the airport. The consultative committee meets quarterly, and the next meeting is in late July, so any comments / complaints / suggestions or feedback should be directed to John Border (20 Coopers Walk).

## Freight Operations at the Airport

In April 2006 Emerald Airways, which operates a lot of the night freight activities at Coventry Airport for Parcellforce, had its operator licence revoked by the Civil Aviation Authority, reportedly after a number of 'incidents'. As a result the company went into administration and its fleet of HS 748's has been grounded, and its staff laid off. It remains to be seen if this makes a long term difference to the amount of noisy night time activity at the airport.

## Proposed Tollbar End Junction Improvements

The Highways Agency is developing proposals for improvements to A45/A46 Tollbar End junction, comprising an underpass from A45 west to A46 north underneath the existing roundabout junction. A consultative group has been formed by the HA, their designer Hyder, contractor Morisson, and local interested and affected parties.

Following consideration of original scheme plans, Bubbenhall Parish Council generally supported the improvements proposed, but objected to the taking of a strip of Green Belt land adjacent to the River Avon, which would reduce the buffer zone between Coventry and Bubbenhall.

John Border attended the consultation meetings for Bubbenhall PC to express these views. At a second meeting of the consultative group on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2006, further options were now under consideration by HA to reduce costs, and it seems that the works in the Green Belt land may now be deleted from the scheme. The timescale for the scheme is slipping. Firm proposals may be published early next year, with a Public Inquiry later next year. If successful, the scheme could be constructed by late 2010/ 2011.

The sun parasols are now up but if the weather does turn inclement there is also a seating area inside. Come along and enjoy the Country Park - we are open daily from 10.30 am.

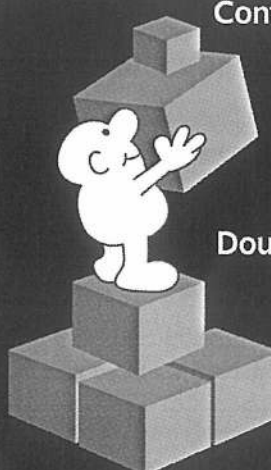

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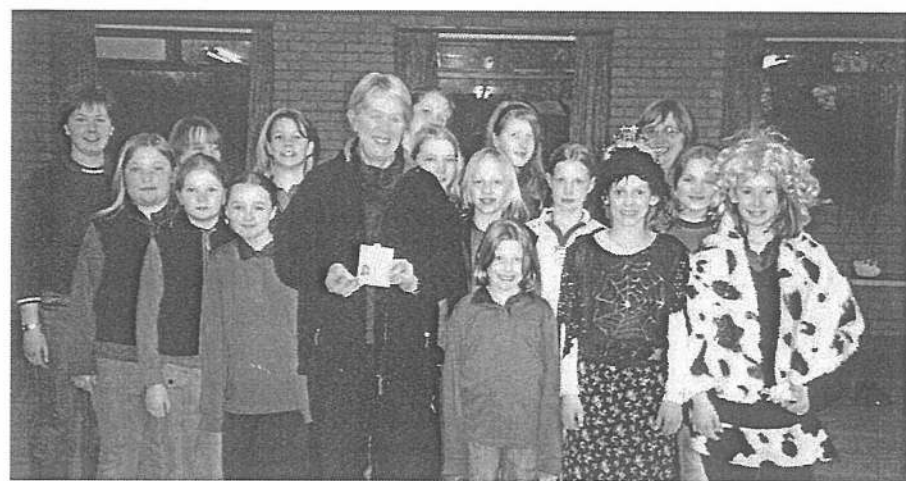
## Bubbenhall Guides

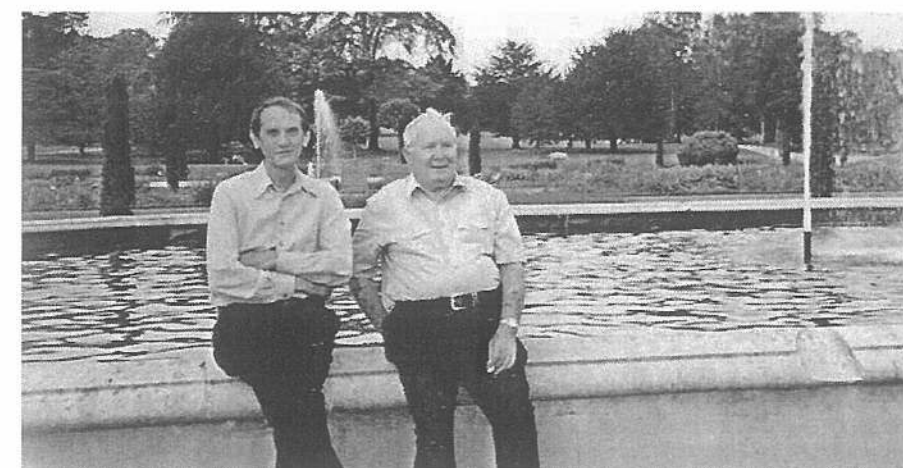
One or two managed to get all the answers right, but some of us did not quite manage to finish.

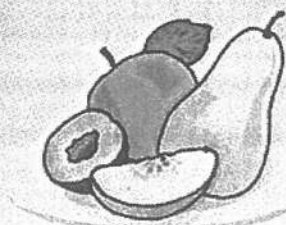

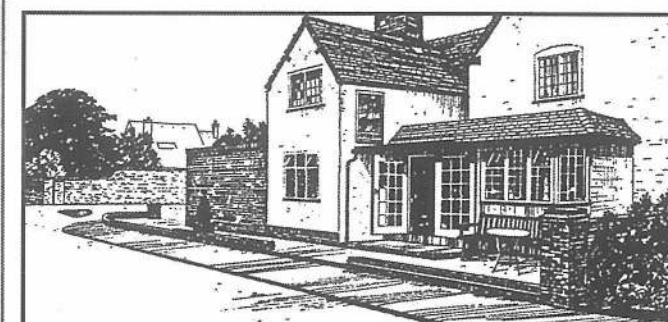

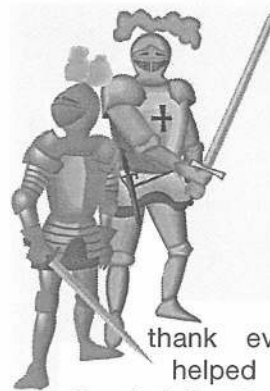

## Bubbenhall Footpaths

Walkers who have been bogged down in the muddy patch in Bubbenhall Wood will welcome the new 12-metre boardwalk, installed in May. The boardwalk protects the woodland soils from erosion, and makes it easier for walkers to use the path through the wood.

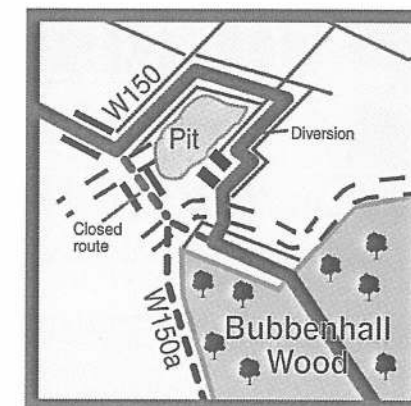
The boardwalk was built by the British Trust for Conservation Volunteers (BTCV) and paid for by Hanson Environmental Trust, with a

contribution from Bubbenhall Parish Council. The project was initiated by the Kenilworth Footpath Preservation Group (KFPG) with the co-operation of Smiths Concrete, owners of the wood.

Bubbenhall is featured in the new edition of KFPG's booklet Kenilworth and Beyond. The booklet describes twenty circular pub walks in mid-Warwickshire, and the Bubbenhall and Wappenbury walk starts at the Three Horseshoes or the Malt Shovel.
