We expect the results to be positive. We also want to arrange an event to officially declare the whole area completed and to switch on the water. We were hoping for the first weeks in September - the original Bubbenhall Wakes Weeks. Here is an extract from Vicky Airey's history detailed on the Bubbenhall website www.bubbenhall.info.



The Wakes were held on the first Sunday after St Giles' Day, 12" September. These ceased during World War I. They were held on the Green and on Pit Hill and down the main street. There were swingboats on the small green opposite The Cottage in the middle of the village, and roundabouts at the bottom of Pit Hill. An old sword was used by someone who was blindfolded to cut at a side of meat. The women used to chase a greased piglet and the one who caught it won it.

We have a plan to acquire a supply of 1litre bottles and have them screen printed - similar to the sample shown in the picture. The idea would be to sell the bottles to raise funds towards a history/storyboard and to enable everyone to have a freely replenishable source of identifiable Bubbenhall Spring water.

Chairman's Report 2009

Personnel

I am pleased to report that at this Annual Parish Assembly we have a full parish council, and that there have been no changes to its membership during 2008-9.

Planning

The Parish Council considered planning applications relating to village properties in 2008-9. All were approved by the Parish Council and all but one of the applications was granted by Warwick District Council. The last application is now subject to an appeal.

The Parish Council monitors those applications that are subject to certain conditions, with help from our District Councillors who liaise on our behalf with the planning department. There is currently one enforcement order on a property in the village. We have been unsuccessful so far in our requests to Rugby District Council to be consulted on planning applications relating to land and property on our boundaries, but we will continue to press for this.

Landfill Site. Weston Lane

The Liaison Committee, which consists of representatives of Bubbenhall and Weston under Parish Wetherley Councils. Warwickshire County Council, Waste Recycling Group, Smith's Concrete, and the Environment Agency, has held three meetings this year. Among the issues discussed was the end date of the current operations of the Waste Recycling Group, the end date of operations for Smith's Concrete including the restoration of Glebe Farm to its original contours, and an application for an incinerator bottom ash processing unit, which Tony Sproul. was rejected at an early stage. The

committee receives reports on the working of the site, on gas migration, and the state of litter. It also reports specific concerns of those residents whose properties are adjacent to the site.

Coventry Airport and Tollbar End

This year has seen a marked reduction in the number of passenger flights from the airport, and more recently a notice of the sale of the airport. The Parish Council is grateful for the work of Cllr John Border who has been our representative on the airport consultative committee, along with Cllr Hammon, who represents Warwick district on the committee.

In the light of the uncertain future of the airport site, we will continue to be a member of CAECA (the Campaign against the Extension of Coventry Airport). We have responded to the consultation on the Tollbar End Improvement Scheme and emphasised our concerns about the proposed use of Green Belt land for the site compound and the use of the stop way at the south end of the existing runway.

Village Spout Project

The Village Spout Sub-Committee under the chairmanship of Tony Sproul, has raised additional monles from WREN and from COMMA in 2008-9. Work on the project is nearing completion. The Parish Council has applied for a 'stopping up order' on an ancient track running across the site, and is in discussion with the owner of the land adjacent to the spout garden, which includes the village pond.

the Parish Council has installed a security gate on the village hall car park to prevent cars being parked overnight. A grant from Warwick District Council provided half the money for the gate, the remainder coming from the precept. PC Everall continues to liaise with Clir Gill Green, chair of Neighbourhood Watch, who keeps the Parish Council updated on incidents in the village. The Mobile Police Station has been in Bubbenhall on two occasions in the past year.

The Parish Council responded to complaints about discipline on the school bus to Learnington, and reported its findings to the Deputy Head of North Learnington School.

Highway Matters

Thanks to the efforts of Clir Doody, a 50 mph speed restriction has been placed on the A445 through the village. Resurfacing of the road has been completed, and interactive warning signs will shortly be installed. A new Bubbenhall sign is to be erected, replacing the old one on the left hand side coming from Learnington. We have continued to press for speed restrictions on Pit Hill, and to express our concern at the speed of traffic on Spring Hill. An unfortunate result of the 50 mph restriction on the A445 has been the derestriction of adjacent minor roads, including Paget's Lane.

Warwickshire County Council highways department has responded effectively to complaints about overhanging trees and overgrown hedges on Stoneleigh Road, and to the condition of the grass verges on the A445. The Parish Council undertook an audit of dropped kerbs in the village, important for wheelchair and pushchair users, and reported the results to the County Council, It is to be hoped that more dropped kerbs will be installed on Moat Close and Cooper's Walk when funds become available.

Recreation Ground

Chris Goddard continues to be employed by the Parish Council for maintenance of the playground equipment, the tennis court area, and for general repairs. There has been a marked improvement in the appearance of the playing fields and adjacent area. The Council commissioned Turfdry to undertake extensive drainage operations on the playing field near the village hall, funded with the help of WDC's Rural Initiatives Fund, and WREN. The Parish Council has also paid for the reduction in the boundary hedge which runs across the car park and behind the village hall.

Finances

The Parish Council's accounts are in good order. Our major annual expenditure is on the maintenance of the recreation ground and the children's play area. Additional expenditure in 2008-9 included the security gate, and hedging on the village hall car park.



Playing Fields and Playground

Bubbenhall Playing Fields and playground is an attractive and valuable asset for our village and is regularly used by locals and residents from our neighbouring villages who enjoy the facilities and location. The playing fields have a football pitch which is successfully used by our Bubbenhall Football Club and the local football league.

Work was carried out in 2008 to improve the drainage of the field along the verandah side of the village hall and a paving slab pathway created. Turf has been laid and the condition of the playing field has improved greatly. The car park has been re-surfaced (Village Hall Committee) and a new security barrier has been erected at the car park entrance. This will secure the playground, village hall and access to the back of local houses after dusk. A new sign has been put up to give details of the closure of the car park.

At the beginning of 2009 a BMX track was created by Graham Johnson using the design of one of our young residents, Tom Green. We hope this facility will address some of the children's wishes to improve the facilities for older children. We will continue to improve this area and remove the many broken bricks which continue to come to the top of the surface. The broken boarding around the enclosed tennis and basket ball courts has been repaired, the tennis posts secured, the restraining wire on the wire

netting fence renewed, a new basketball net put up and the tennis net winder repaired.

A "play area safety inspection" was carried out on 9" September 2008 by RoSPA. The check was made to the site, access, seating, litter bins, cleanliness, fencing, planting and the safety of the play equipment.

- Small toddler swing
- Seal rocker
- Overhead cable ride
- · Multi-activity unit
- · Trim trail
- 4 seat rotary unit
- The fenced tennis/basket ball court

There were no high risk repairs needed and medium and low risk repairs and other jobs have been carried out by Chris Goddard e.g. the swing frame has been recently painted, chains to the trim-trail shortened and new bark put down under the aerial runway and the multiplay unit. Chris also keeps the bins emptied, the weeds under control and does general maintenance tasks.

A new item of play equipment has been bought to replace the rocking tractor removed last year. After consulting parents and child minders it was decided to buy a crawl tunnel so that very young children have something more suitable to explore.

Grass cutting, tree trimming and mole treatment are all done regularly as well as regular checks to all playground equipment.




St Giles' Bellringers


