Earlier in the year Cllrs Haynes, Keates and Morrison formed a subcommittee to explore possibilities for development of the BMX track. After consultation with youngsters in the village a five year plan has been drawn up, and sources of funding for the project are currently being explored.

Precept

At its January meeting the Parish Council agreed to keep the precept at the 2011 rate.

Our major items of expenditure, as ever, are insurance, the maintenance and replacement of playground equipment, the upkeep of the recreation ground and the spout garden, and the general maintenance of public areas. We continue to seek value for money, and to encourage competitive quotes for all expenditure.

Emergency Committee

Cllrs Havnes and Morrison are the Parish Council representatives on the village Emergency Committee, which also includes Tony Cox (chair) and Norman Busby. The Committee are currently updating the Emergency Plan for the village.

Diamond Jubilee Tea **Party**

To mark the Diamond Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen the Parish Council ordered 120 jubilee mugs which were presented to the young people of the village at the Jubilee tea party on 16th June 2012.

Other activities

Among the regular matters discussed by the Parish Council are the bus services to and from the village, the state of the highways and the roads through the village, drainage, traffic calming and the maintenance of the village footpaths.

Conclusion

I would like to thank members of the Parish Council for their continued efforts in what has been another busy year. As ever, we thank our three District and County Councillors for their help and advice and for their attendance at our meetings, and we congratulate Cllr Doody who has been elected Chairman of Warwickshire County Council.

Coventry and Warwickshire Gateway

The Parish Council was notified of the proposed Coventry and Warwickshire Gateway Partnership (a 50:50 venture between Roxhill Developments Limited and Rigby Holdings Limited): including the improvements to the Toll Bar Island and A45 (with the Highways Agency), the Jaguar site and the proposed Baginton and Bubbenhall development sites. The project which will utilise green belt as well as contaminated land will reportedly generate 10,000 jobs plus 4,000 jobs planned for the Jaguar site.

The developers recently presented to Warwick District Council's Proposed Development Review Forum which members of the Parish Council were invited to attend. Councillors were told that the planning application was

likely to go to Planning Committee in December. WDC's Head of Planning also reminded the PC that if planning permission was to be granted, the project would be have to be agreed by the Secretary of State because it is on greenbelt land.

Bubbenhall Parish Council has been working closely with Baginton Parish Council on this proposal and conducted a survey of residents who attended the recent consultation event. The Parish Council will do its upmost to keep residents informed of any further updates.

Policing and Neighbourhood Watch

Following the resignation of Cllr Gill Green, the remaining Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinators and interested villagers attended the March meeting of the Parish Council, and resolved to reconstitute Bubbenhall's Neighbourhood Watch Committee. Cllr Haynes convened a further meeting of coordinators at which Jeff Veasey agreed

to become overall co-ordinator. The group agreed an action plan, and villagers took on responsibility for specific areas and roads in the village.

Members of Neighbourhood Watch, the Parish Council and residents have signed up to receive regular email updates from Warwickshire police on crime in the district. A mobile police station has visited the village on two occasions this year.

Recreation Ground

The Parish Council went out to tender for the mowing and maintenance of the recreation ground. Following negotiation the contract has been awarded to Heritage and Sons for a further year.

This year's ROSPA report on the playground equipment was again positive, with only some minor repairs required. Cllr Sam Baker has agreed to take overall responsibility for the playground following the resignation of Cllr Keates. Chris Goddard





Parish Council Report

Personnel

Since the meeting of the Annual Parish Assembly in 2011 Bubbenhall Parish Council has co-opted two new councillors, following the resignation of Cllrs Gill Green and Aldo Keates. Wendy Harrison and Mark Symes were formally co-opted at the April meeting of the Council. The Parish Council would like to thank to Gill Green for her many years of service on the Council and for acting as the co-ordinator of Bubbenhall Neighbourhood Watch. We also wish to thank Aldo Keates, who took responsibility for the upkeep of the playing fields and the maintenance of the playground equipment during his two years on the Council. All of the new Councillors elected in May 2011 have attended training courses, and those joining the Council recently have enrolled or will be enrolling on similar courses this year.

Affordable Housing

Following the public consultation event in the Village Hall in June 2011,

Warwickshire Rural Community Council produced a report which recommended that the Parish Council accept its proposal for a development of six dwellings as affordable housing. The Parish Council meetings in July and September were attended by a large number of villagers who expressed concern about the infrastructure of the development, particularly the sewers and access to the site, the types of housing proposed, the possible future expansion of the green belt site, and the occupancy of the units when local tenants moved on. Further consultations were held with Severn Trent and Warwick District Council's housing department. At its December meeting the Parish Council voted unanimously to reject WRCC's

Planning

In June 2011 The Parish Council expressed its opposition to an application by Smith's Concrete for an extension of sand and gravel extraction, and for waste disposal for

a further five years, taking the dates to 2016 and 2021 respectively. Despite the Parish Council's objections Warwickshire County Council granted the application. In the course of the year the Parish Council has considered a number of applications relating to alterations and extensions to existing properties in the village and developments on the Middlemarch Business Park.

High Speed Rail (HS2)


The Parish Council responded to the HS2 consultation by the deadline of 29th July 2011. Following the Government's decision to proceed with the project, we have supported Warwick District Council's efforts to secure a judicial review. The Parish Council has joined the Offchurch and Cubbington Community Forum who are in discussion with HS2 Ltd about mitigation. Cllr Symes is acting as the Council's representative.

Landfill Site, Weston Lane

The Liaison Committee, consists of representatives of Bubbenhall and Weston under Wetherlev Parish Councils. Warwickshire County Council, Waste Recycling Group, Smith's Concrete, and the Environment Agency, hold two meetings in each year in January and July. The Committee received reports on the working of the site, on gas migration, and the state of litter. It also reported specific concerns of those residents whose properties are adjacent to the site. permission is currently being sought by Smith's Concrete to extend the period of working at the Bubbenhall site in order to process materials from the new quarry at Wolston Fields Farm.

Coventry Airport

The Parish Council, with the help of District and County Councillors has continued its opposition to the expansion of the airport, including the resumption of commercial flights. It has retained its membership of CAECA (Campaign against the Expansion of Coventry Airport) for this purpose, although it has been denied a representative on the airport's

- 3. Be aware Toll Bar island improvements have already been agreed and will commence in April 2013 and are separate from the proposed Gateway development.
- Closure of access from Rowley Road on to Toll Bar island. Whilst this is an inconvenience if you want to go on South or East, it will also stop you going into Coventry via the London Road as this will also be a closed route.
