Parish Council Report

Personnel

At our April meeting Councillor Peter Hennessey tendered his resignation due to his impending departure from the village. The appropriate steps have been taken to publicize the vacancy. If there is not a demand for an election the Council has the power to co-opt a new member. Expressions of interest will be invited.

Planning

The Parish Council considered 12 planning applications relating to village properties in 2009-10. Of these 11 were granted, and one refused by Warwick District Council. The Parish Council monitors those applications that are subject to certain conditions, with help from our District Councillors who liaise on our behalf with the planning department. There is currently one enforcement order on a property in the village. Rugby DC now notify us of planning applications relating to land and property on our boundaries.

Affordable Housing

The Parish Council supported a village wide survey on the need for Affordable Housing in the village. The survey was completed in March, and the results are expected

shortly from the Warwickshire Rural Community Council.

Landfill Site, Weston Lane

The Liaison Committee, which consists of representatives of Bubbenhall and Weston under Wetherley Parish Councils, WCC, Waste Recycling Group, Smith's Concrete, and the Environment Agency, has held three meetings this year. Among the issues discussed was the end date of operations for Smith's Concrete including the restoration of Glebe Farm to its original contours. The Parish Council were successful in securing the withdrawal of an application for a new access to Glebe Farm from Pagets Lane.

Policing and Neighbourhood Watch

A grant from WDC has provided a portion of the money for the installation of a second security gate and bollards adjacent to the

playing field at the far end of the village hall car park. The remainder of the cost will be met from the precept. Warwickshire Police continue to liaise with Cllr Gill Green, chair of Neighbourhood Watch, who keeps the Parish Council updated on incidents in the village. PC Mike Everall continues as our designated officer, with the assistance of 2 police community support officers.

Highway Matters

A new Bubbenhall sign is to be erected on the A445. Following complaints from village residents, a litter bin has been installed on the lay-by by the nursery school. WDC has agreed to empty the bin.

Broadband

There have been many complaints about the quality of Broadband provision in the village. The Parish Council has explored the possibility of privately funded broadband, although there does not seem to be sufficient interest to generate the investment required. The Clerk has been in contact with Open Reach but with as yet no positive result.

Precept

The Parish Council took the decision to apply for a substantial increase in our precept from WDC for this year only. We did so for a number of reasons. The small increases in the annual precept since 2000 have not kept pace with our escalating costs – for insurance, the maintenance of the recreation ground and playground equipment, the cutting of verges and general village maintenance.

The sub-committee charged with developing the Spout Garden have been very successful in generating grant income, but several of the grants have required contributions from the Parish Council as a prerequisite of the award. The ongoing maintenance of the Spout Garden – mowing, electricity, insurance, and pest control – is now an additional annual commitment for the Council. The Village Hall Committee has been equally successful in raising money for renovations to the hall. This year the Parish Council agreed to

contribute a substantial sum as part of their successful grant application.

We have asked for an increase in the precept for 2009-10 to meet these demands and restore our reserves which have become depleted. We anticipate that the precept will be lower next year, although it cannot return to the original level in view of demands on the Council's budget.

Village Hall

Total refurbishment of the main kitchen and toilets has been agreed and will take place during the first three weeks of August. The total cost will be £29,138. The Parish Council has agreed to pay £1500, grants have been obtained and the remaining cost will be met from village hall funds. A health inspection has been carried out. Some minor work needs to be done in both kitchens and will be carried out during the refurbishment. Fire Assessment is carried out regularly and the exit light has been replaced.

There have been some minor social issues during the year, with persons

hanging around the hall causing damage. The veranda is being used as a through-way for bikes and it has been decided that further paving slabs be laid to provide access from the car park to the playing field.

Following discussions with the Charities Commission with regards to amending the wording of the constitution, the charity shall henceforth adopt the name Bubbenhall Village Hall. The village hall continues to be well used by regular groups and the committee hopes that the refurbishments will encourage more outside bookings.

Recreation Ground

Following the retirement of Mr Wagstaff who has held the contract for mowing and maintaining the recreation ground, tenders were sought for his replacement. The contract has been given to Heritage and Sons for a period of one year in the first instance. Chris Goddard continues to be employed by the Parish Council for maintenance of the playground equipment, the tennis court area, and for general repairs. There has been a marked

improvement in the appearance of the playing fields and adjacent area. Fly tipping on the lane adjacent to the recreation ground is currently under investigation by WDC.

The Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (ROSPA) carried out their inspection in September 2009. In the report they stated that Bubbenhall had an "attractive range of good value play equipment for all ages with a nearby MUGA (multi-use games area). The playground is in good condition and is well-maintained." They also recognised the hard work that has been done over the year in the games area and wrote: "Considerable resources and work have been put into the playground which has resulted in a much higher standard of provision". We are very pleased with this report and would like to thank Chris Goddard for his work over the year for carrying out regular maintenance tasks around the playground and in the village.

The equipment was inspected and all were found to be in a safe state with no high level risks. Also the

seating, access, fencing, signage, litter bins and cleanliness were found to be suitable for the area. However, it was recommended that bicycle racks were installed. Improvements this year have included new tennis posts and a winder net wire. There will be replacement basket ball nets up before the summer starts and a delivery of bark has been spread which ensures a safe landing for the children playing in the playground area.

After the very cold weather the moles moved in and made quite a mess of the playing fields, causing problems for the footballers and also made the safe surface areas under the play equipment very slippery. The grass cutting team have now agreed to use a regular anti-mole treatment.

In addition to the work on the playing fields, work has been carried out in other areas of the village including a new litter bin in the lay-by on the A445, a replacement gate catch on the gate from Orchard Way to the A445, leaf clearing in the alley ways and some road sign cleaning. Unfortunately, the catch on the gate has once again been broken so we need to investigate a new solution to ensure the gate stays shut.

We should like to thank Bubbenhall parishioners for their vigilance in alerting us when a problem occurs on the playground and playing fields in order to maintain a safe playground and for their suggestions for improving the provision for us all.

Coventry Airport

Cllr John Border is our representative on the Airport Consultative Committee, along with Cllr Hammon, who represents WDC on the committee. With their help the Parish Council has been monitoring developments, including the recent sale of the airport, from which no concrete plans have yet emerged. This was a turbulent year for Coventry Airport, starting the year being put up for sale in May '09.

There have only been two Airport Consultative Committee meetings during the year. At the first, in July,

the airport's Director Brian Cox continued to be upbeat about the prospects of finding potential purchasers or investors in the airport, and also of attracting new commercial and freight operators. However there continued to be no scheduled passenger flights operating from the airport and little immediate prospect of any commencing in the near future. The airport remained closed at night, and consequently the number of noise complaints was very low.

By December '09, the airport remained unsold, and was facing a high court winding up petition due to unpaid creditors. The airport closed for commercial operations and had its aerodrome licence suspended. A frantic period of activity followed as the company was wound up, and Coventry CC tried to find a purchaser. Finally in April 2010, it was announced a company led by Sir Peter Rigby had concluded negotiations to take on the airport. It is understood from Sir Peter's

presentation to the Consultative Committee in March that the 'deal' negotiated with Coventry CC revolves around including land around the airport for redevelopment adjacent to Rowley Road including the airport museum, railway sidings and Rugby Club. Further details remain unclear.

At time of writing, the airport is attempting to regain its aerodrome licence, having to put new arrangements in place for air traffic control and fire cover, and it looks like its immediate future as an airport has been secured once again.

Conclusion

I would like to thank members of the Parish Council for their continued efforts in what has been another busy year. In particular I would like to thank our clerk for her excellent support to all our activities. As ever, we thank our three District and County councillors for their help, advice and their attendance at our meetings.

Church architect Peter Sheen, for organising this very necessary work to the fabric of our Church building.


Churchyard maintenance

Know Your Rights!

Advice from Warwickshire County Council Trading Standards Service

Phishing Scam

The internet is a fantastic resource when used properly but unfortunately criminals are making the most of it too. One widely used scam is the "phishing" email. These pretend to be from a bank, EBAY or PayPal, etc.

They will ask for personal information such as account data and login details so they can gain access to your accounts or commit other crimes using your identity. Recently there have been fake emails claiming to be from the Civil Aviation Authority offering compensation to travellers left stranded by the recent volcanic eruption in Iceland. Recipients were asked for passport data, bank account details and other personal information in order to gain compensation.

So if you suspect an email is from a fraudster phishing:

- never give out personal information in an email
- never click on any links it contains, delete the email

If you are concerned that you may have fallen victim to such a scam act immediately. If relevant, log into your relevant accounts and change your usernames and passwords. This will stop the fraudsters accessing your accounts. Contact your banks and financial institutions and make them aware of the situation in case of problems.

Rogue Traders

Summer is a particularly busy time for rogue traders and Trading Standards, together with the Police have been cracking down on them with special intelligence led operations.

Whether it's tarmac your drive, gardening or building work, rogue traders use all types of tricks and intimidation to get householders to pay high prices for poor workmanship or in some cases no work at all. Here are some of their tricks that you should avoid:

- Pretending to be from the local council, offering to tarmac your driveway using materials they falsely claim are "left over".
- Claiming they are working on a neighbour's property in order to give you a false sense of "trustworthiness".
- Making up problems which don't exist in hard to reach places eg, the roof
- Using false names and addresses and untraceable mobile phone numbers.
- Starting work straightaway to prevent you from changing your mind and not giving cancellation rights which they are obliged to by law.

To avoid becoming a rogue trader victim, never agree to working being done by the first person who comes to your home and don't be rushed into making a decision on the doorstep. If you need working doing, seek recommendations from trustworthy local traders.

The Village Green and the Village Spring area

Whilst the project is now complete, there will be an ongoing requirement for maintenance and enhancement over time.

We applied to Awards for All (The Big Lottery Fund) for funding for fitting a UV filtration system to the spring water outlet and for enhancing the original spout pipe-work. We were unsuccessful as there were only 49 awards out of 144 applications. Our application did not score well enough against the grant panel criteria. We will therefore need to look for alternative grant support.

Of all of the enhancements we may wish for, the UV treatment of the Spring water is probably the most important in the long term. This would ensure that the water quality from the Spring was always maintained as sterilized, bacteria free natural spring water. Reviewed costings in this area are now coming in at between £1500 and £2000. There would then be minimal electricity costs and annual UV bulb replacement (£65).

The only currently outstanding actions ultimately requiring funding are the sourcing of a permanent Christmas tree and the design concept for the Village storyboard.

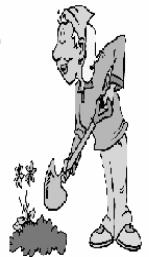

exchanges, and despite defending well for much of the half conceded two goals before the break.

And when suddenly it became 4-1, the game appeared to be over and Bubbenhall faced playing damage limitation. The introduction of long throw specialist Nathan Woodfield would however change the game dramatically.

First captain Dave Paget beat the office trap to slide home to make it 4-2, and when the first of Woodfield's demon throw-ins caused havoc in the Khalsa defence Halford pounced on a flick on to score his second of the game. And with barely 2 minutes to go Bubbers did the unthinkable when Halford got on the end of yet another Woodfield missile to prod home the equaliser and bag his hat trick.

In the darkening conditions there would however be another twist to the proceedings when the officials failed to convince the hosts to turn the floodlights on. So controversially there would be no extra-time and it

was straight to the lottery penalties.

First to step up was hat-trick hero Halford, but the striker's tame effort was easily saved. Keeper Gary Bevan produced a fine save to put Bubbers back in it, and then along with player-manager Liam Flowers and Dave Protheroe found the net with spot-kicks. Midfield batter Jamie Stokes could not repeat his heroics from the semi-final though as the shoot-out moved into sudden death and Bubbenhall were heartbroken.

The side had however shown great character to run their opponents all so close and can look to this game for inspiration when no doubt facing up hill battles in the future. Returning to league action, Bubbenhall as often in recent years teetered on the brink of winning promotion but in the end had to settle for a fourth place finish in Leamington & District Sunday League Division Three.

Close season signing Simon Protheroe ended his first campaign

with the club as top scorer with 22 goals, closely followed by Blake Thomas on 16 strikes while perennial top marksmen Halford netted 15 times. Halford's opening strike in the Cancer Cup final will probably go down as the club's goal of the season, closely followed by a 35 yard Dave Protheroe effort which crashed in off the underside of the bar at home to Cricketer's.

After four years in charge Liam 'Raoul' Flowers is stepping down as player-manager to concentrate on playing ahead of the 2010/11 season and everyone connected with the club would like to thank him for his efforts during his spell at the helm – we think!

Thanks also go to everyone who has come down to watch the team play over the last year and our sponsors Crescent Garage and The Three Horseshoes.

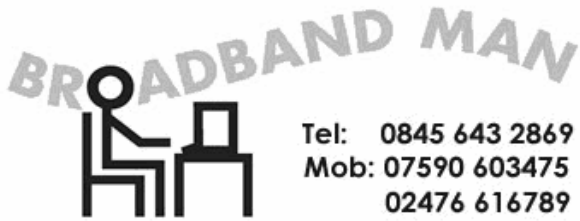
