St Giles

Easter is past and Summer (we hope) is about to start, so it might be a bit late for spring cleaning, but nevertheless we

have spring-cleaned our services.

We have a new pattern of services at St Giles – you may have seen notices around the village or read about it in the church newsletter. We have a new time for our main morning service; it now starts at 11am instead of 10.30am. If you are wondering why, there are three reasons.

The first reason is that I haven't been able to be at certain services in Bubbenhall because there has been a service at Ryton at the same time, so I haven't even met some members of the

congregation, let alone had the chance to worship with them or even preach to them (some of them may of course be quite pleased about the last point). There is another advantage to the new time; I can be at both churches for big occasions like Easter and Christmas when I would really like to be there, instead of having to get a visiting priest.

The second reason is that we can now offer a wider range of services. We've introduced two new services every month; a Family Service on the first Sunday in the month at 11am, and a modern language Communion on the third Sunday at 8am. We hope to have something for everybody. By the time you read this, we will have had at least one of each of these new services. As I am writing this, I can say that our first Family Service went very well indeed; our excellent bell ringers turned out, and a medium sized and enthusiastic congregation sang some modern(ish) hymns as well as one or two old favourites.

The third reason is that (with the exception of the fifth Sunday in the month – when there is one) if you come to church at 11am on any Sunday you will find a service about to start. We are all creatures of habit, and this we hope will make the church-going habit easier to catch than it used to be.

One further point – if you missed the wonderful Easter flowers in church, then I can tell you that there are rumours of a Flower Festival some time in late summer; watch this space and other spaces.

leighbourhood Watch

Since our last report we have had two 'sneak in' the fts reported, both through insecure rear doors and while persons were at home. Property including credit cards etc were stolen. We can only once again 'stress' the importance of keeping outer doors locked at all times whether in the house or garden. We would also remind residents to keep all garden sheds and gardens locked as previously these have been targeted and property stolen.

An especially mean theft has been committed against two elderly men when a young man, between 20 and 30 years of age, was admitted by them when he falsely stated he was checking on census papers. He was in possession of a clipboard with papers on it. Once inside the conversation changed and he then said that he was also checking on counterfeit notes that were circulating in the area and did they have any. £300 was produced that of course he declared were infact counterfeit and did they have any more. A further £400 was produced that were also declared the same and taken possession of with a promise that a receipt would be issued (but of course wasn't) and he made off in a blue motor car. May sees the introduction of our new Summer timetable. We are also pleased to add that our fares will remain the same at this time. 

At the recent annual safety inspection of the children's playground equipment almost all of it failed to meet the European regulations and as such, now needs to be replaced.

In order to investigate the best way of going about this we have formed a separate committee to look, not only at the replacement, but also at the overall playing fields design and content. In view of the inspector's comments we have decided to go for a complete new playground and have submitted our suggested design for the playing fields, which has been accepted by the Parish Council. A sketch of our proposals appears below.

After consulting the actual people who will be using the equipment, the Toddlers, Rainbows, Brownies, Guides and the Youth Club the most popular items appear to be a large multiplay, an are doing, do please get in touch with aerial runway (zip-wire), skateboard ramps, a redesigned BMX track at the far end of the fields and several smaller

We've had 2 sessions with our coach and a third one is booked for the 6th July. The kids are getting a lot of use and enjoyment from the posts, both collectively in a team environment and individually 'Slam Dunking'. This is a great asset for the young people of the village which not only provides a new sports activity but which will encourage more to take part and keep fit.....which brings me to another bit of good news....

Last October the Parish Council were invited by the National Health Service to write a report of 2500 words entitled 'Healthy Lives' detailing any major health initiatives in the village which have produced substantial healthy gains for the local residents. Youth Club were invited to reply to the challenge explaining the increase that we have brought about in sports activity since the inception of the group, together with our vision of where we see it going in the next 12-18 months. The letter was sent last December - and promptly forgotten about!. It was therefore a pleasant surprise to get a call in May from the Chairman of Warwickshire Health Authority to say that they were very impressed with the work we have achieved in the village and they would like to make a donation of equipment in keeping with the title of the project. Sandie & I represented the club at the presentation ceremony in Shire Hall at the end of May and were delighted in achieving one of the top awards enabling us to further develop the sports facilities that we have with the purchase of a Tennis Tutor Ball Serving Machine. Every member with a racket will now be able to take part and it is hoped that this will be in place ready for the 'Bubbenhall at Wimbledon' season!!

I am presently involved in the setting

up of the Bubbenhall Village web site and leading on from this I hope, time permitting, to set up a Youth Club web page, constantly updated with all the activities and opportunities that are available to members. This will hopefully link to other Youth Clubs and Youth pages and enable us to exchange ideas with each other. I would also like to be able to contact members using e-mail for those who are on the internet. A form will be coming your way soon asking for your email address, please get it back to me and I will add you to my group.

We are now in June and planning our

activities through till September. A separate letter will be going out to all members just as soon as it is completed. I can tell you that the next 4 months will include more basketball, a car maintenance course, swimming at Newbold Comyn, a full week of activities from 13th - 18th August with Warwickshire Association of Youth Clubs, a day trip to Blackpool Pleasure Beach and at least one B-B-Q, depending on the weather! We do however have a problem which parents can help us out with - we don't have sufficient adult supervision on a Friday night. Do you have knowledge of something you can impart to the kids; a skill that you could teach either the older or younger members; are you keen on craftwork, cooking, walking, conservation, DIY, football, badminton; could you run the tuckshop for a night or simply be around.
