



## FUTURE OF BUBBENHALL 'SCHOOL' ANNEXE STILL UNCERTAIN !

The Governing Body of Provost Williams Primary School put the Bubbenhall Annexe under threat in January following the issue of a consultation document. The document outlined an action plan to resolve the issues raised by a recent OFSTED inspection and outlines two options to address OFSTED's main Key Issue for Action:

Make more effective use of the financial resources and accommodation available to the school by rationalising them against its long-term strategic needs. The two options put forward are:

- Option 1;**  
Retaining Bubbenhall Annexe
- Option 2;**  
Closing Bubbenhall Annexe

Within the last newsletter, it was stated that a final announcement was to be made by the Governing Body by the end of

March. On the 24th March, all parents received a letter effectively stating that the decision was to be deferred until early May to enable the school's LEA representative, Colin James, to discuss the issue with elected members of the LEA on 30th March.

BAAG immediately sent letters to both the Chair of Education Committee & the County Education Officer outlining our case and to support us in retaining the annexe. After a lengthy wait for the minutes of the meeting, they effectively stated that the Governing Body had a difficult decision to make but the status quo would be unacceptable.

**This does not mean that the annexe has to close.**

If the Governing Body can find ways to make more effective use of school resources, then there would be an argument for

keeping the annexe open.

With information obtained by a parent, BAAG approached the Chair of Governors suggesting that the Governing Body approaches other more independent organisations such as the Early Years Department of the LEA, The Small Schools Forum, The Association of Small Schools and The Pastoral Education Inspectorate.

The reply to the letter stated that the Governing Body had already approached the Early Years and Pastoral Inspectorate soon after the OFSTED report was released. They were also soon to meet a representative of the Association of Small Schools.

On Tuesday 4th May, the Governing Body came together to have a final discussion and make a decision. The discussion ended with the Governing Body unable to reach a majority

decision. As all members of the Governing Body were present, it must be assumed that the Chair of Governors did not make his casting vote.

In a letter to the parents, the Chair of Governors stated that they would have further discussions with the Diocese and the LEA in a final attempt to identify and explore any other practical way of resolving Key Issue 1. The Governing Body will meet again on 16th June where they must make a final decision. For further information, contact:

**1902** Edward VII Coronation

**1906** New Parish Rate basis installed

**1908** Small Holding Act

**1909** Sewage works at Baginton installed for Coventry

**1911** Coronation of George V

**1913** Village was relying on spring water

**1922** Suggested war memorial on Village Green

**1931 - 1934** Electric power brought to the Village, and a light put into the church. Coventry Fire Brigade to cover our village.

**1937** Coronation of George VI and a request for a bus service to the village

**1946** Parish Council formed

**1947** Initial discussions to have a new Village Hall

# COVENTRY AND WARWICKSHIRE AIRPORT ACTION GROUP (CWAAG)

## UPDATE-PARCELFORCE DEVELOPMENT AND COVENTRY AIRPORT

Regrettably there is little to report since the last newsletter

### Parcelforce

The construction and fitting out continues with the first signs of operational activity anticipated in the autumn and something like full scale operation effective from

spring next year. Though it may be in vain, based on guidance from the European Commission and case law the House of Lords have been asked to reconsider their earlier decision to refuse leave to appeal. Should they continue to refuse to see our arguments the matter will continue to be put in front of the European Court of Human Rights, long winded though that is.

### Airport

There continues to be little or no indication from the Airport management as to what their plans are regarding the running of the Airport, other than to continue as before, presumably running at a substantial loss. The loss reported to March 1998 was some £844,298, some £703,337 more than budget. One wonders how, if as one assumes, this is continuing to

be supported.

We continue to wait for the DETR to honour their offer of talks regarding the control of night flights. They have become very reticent now that they have been asked for specific dates. We will nevertheless continue to pursue them.
