PARISH COUNCIL

Tuesday 9th May was the day of the Parish Assembly and Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council. Cllr Mrs Jackie Lloyd stood down from the position of Chairman and Cllr Alan Gibson resigned from the Parish Council. A vote of thanks was passed to both of these people for all their hard work and efforts during their time in post. Cllr Mrs Sue Wareham was elected as Chairman for the forthcoming year with Cllr Mrs Jackie Lloyd becoming vice-chairman.

Due to Alan's retirement, a vacancy now exists on the Parish council. Notices have been posted on the two village notice boards for nominations. This is your chance to serve as a Parish Councillor and represent the community. Any elector willing to stand, should declare their interest in writing

to the Parish Clerk by the date on the displayed noticeboard.

I reported in the last newsletter that the Parish Council are trying to resolve the lack of water coming from the spout. A Company has been employed by Smith's Concrete to jet the spout and investigate if there are any blockages. This has now been done and unfortunately has not made any improvement to the flow of water. We are now awaiting a report from Smith's Concrete geologist as to why the spout is running so slowly.

Bubbenhall has once again been entered into the Best Kept Village Competition. The judging is to take place within the first two weeks of June, this will co-incide with the National Spring Cleaning Campaign that Norman Busby is organising

around the village.

Warwick District Council Youth Sports Development team will be visiting Bubbenhall on Thursday 31st August, to organise play and multisport activities for children aged 4—14 years of age, further details are given at the bottom of page 1, and will be posted on the village notice boards.

A survey is being carried out by Warwickshire County Council regarding the transport in rural areas. COVENTRY & WARWICKSHIRE AIRPORT ACTION GROUP (CWAAG)

PARCELFORCE

Parcelforce have now quit the North side of the airport moving the whole of their operation to the South side. The level of activity remains well below that projected, it is therefore too soon to draw any conclusions regarding the impact of this move.

AIRPORT

At the last consultative committee meeting there were no indications of any imminent increases in air traffic either night or day. In fact the levels as reported are noticeably reduced on this time last year. The airport operator continues to look for additional business.

Progress continues with clearing and tidying the north side of the airfield.

The main entrance to the airport is being reorganised to the benefit of Baginton with no apparent negative results for any others.

The new extension of the apron on the South side is now well advanced, whilst discussions are in progress regarding the paving of the existing

grass stopway on the Western end of the runway. This, in conjunction with a request to the CAA regarding an increase in the approach angle for landing is hoped to improve conditions for those in Willenhall.

MEETING WITH LOCAL MPs

As a result of our meeting with the local MPs a meeting in London with the Minister responsible for Aviation has taken place. Whilst it would be foolish to imagine that much will come of the meeting, the arguments that were put forward in support of our request for airports such as Coventry to be controlled by central government were understood and sympathised with.

Our MPs pushed for the minister to review the situation, the Minister committed himself to do so and report back to the MPs. As and when we have a response regarding Government policy it will be reported.

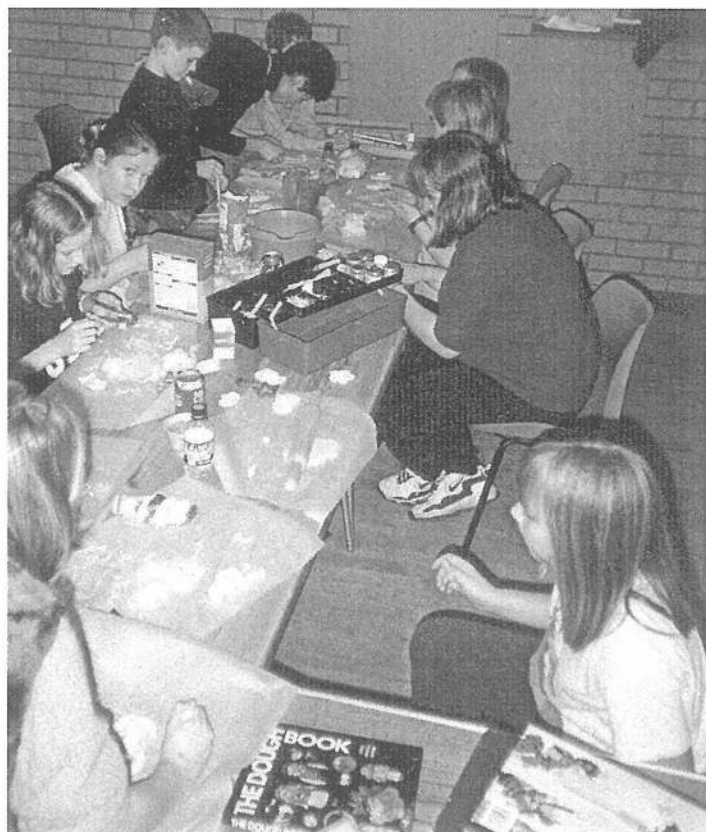
We were all very pleased (as can be seen in the photo) with the generous donation from Smiths Concrete and the major

7pm Dance demonstrations by Sarah Cooke School of Dance followed by Evening entertainment until late

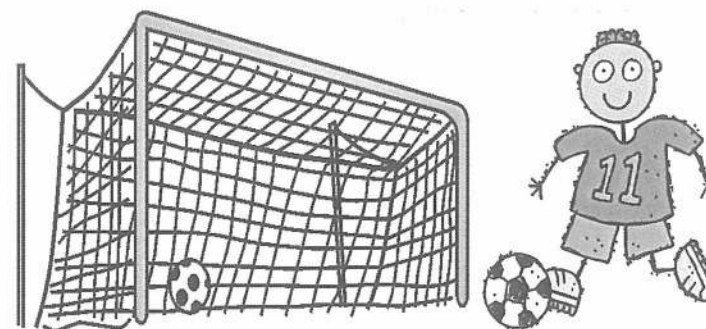
