Due to the sudden and very sad death of Trevor on Boxing Day we now enter an unspecified period of time without our own vicar. During this time the Churchwardens are responsible, together with the Rural Dean, for organising weekly services, baptisms, weddings and funerals. AIRPORT

At the latest consultative committee meeting there were no indications of any imminent increases in air traffic either night or day.

The airport operator continues to look for additional business, which it categorised as being "daytime business flights not tour operators".

Progress continues with clearing and tidying the north side of the airfield.

The level of recorded complaints has dropped dramatically, one suspects that this has nothing to do with any lack of reason to complain, but everything to do with the fact that at the moment, unless aircraft are breaking rules little can be done about it.

A review of the flight paths and noise abatement procedures is being undertaken. As a result of the review It is likely that planes taking off to the west will turn closer to Bubbenhall, to avoid encroaching on Cubbington.

Notwithstanding government's recent indication that it is not proposing to pursue control of aircraft noise and the highways authority taking minimal action to deal with the increasing problem of the Toll Bar roundabout, a meeting with three local MPs is scheduled to take place shortly.



HIGH AIMS FOR JOAN HOLT MEMORIAL FUND

Joan Holt a resident of Darfield Court was unfortunately diagnosed with Breast Cancer in 1994. Joan bravely fought this illness and during this time organised various fund raising events for the Breast Cancer Screening Service raising over £7,000 in 3 years. Joan's aim was to raise a total £10,000. Sadly, Joan died before her dream became reality. But on her death the residents of Darfield Court and various friends formed a committee to carry out Joan's wish to raise the balance of this money and organised the highly successful fun day on 21st August, 1999, held at the Three Horse Shoes. The total money raised from this day was £6,080, taking Joan's total far above her dream on £10,000.

A small group of representatives met with Dr Wallis - Clinical Radiologist from Coventry & Warwickshire Breast Screening Centre to discuss how best the money could be used. Dr Wallis made several suggestions research, sponsoring a student or purchasing equipment. Unfortunately, the Breast Screening Services shopping list is hugely expensive!! At this present time, the Service is in the process of changing and updating all its mammography equipment using money provided by the Lottery. The downside to this is the fund is only prepared to purchase like for like equipment. Dr Wallis explained that the Service was very keen to purchase a digital stereo x-ray system and went on

the replacement new equipment) every time they need to take a biopsy x-ray or changes that they cannot see on ultrasound or physically feel, they use conventional film and a computer to accurately place the biopsy needle. This does produce good results but takes up to ∫ hour, with the patient clamped into the machine. The digital equipment is essentially an expensive camera added to the x-ray mammography machine, which produces the picture in 4 seconds as opposed to 4 minutes with film. This enables the radiologists to gain more accurate and consistent results and reduces the time the patient is subjected to discomfort.

system. At present (and with

The current cost of this piece of machinery is between £50 -£60,000 and it is the aim of the Joan Holt Memorial Fund to raise a further £6,000, through fund raising events in the year 2000. With last years effort this will bring our total contribution to £12,000+.

Fund raising has already started John Holloway - Landlord of the Three Horse Shoes has gave up alcohol for the month of February and has received in excess of £2,500 sponsorship. A golf day was also held in February and a sponsored slim. The major event of the year will be another Fun Day to be held on week-end 19/20th August, 2000 - further details to be given in the next newsletter.

Breast Cancer effects 1 in 11 women and if caught early it can be very successfully treated, the aim of the Coventry & Warwickshire Breast Screening Service is to reduce the mortality in the population screened by 25%

A NEW all-weather sports and games pitch has been unveiled in Bubbenhall.

The £19,000 pitch can be used for most popular sports and activities such as football, tennis, netball and basketball. Local children are

main users of the area which has been funded by the parish council and Warwick District Council.

It was built after residents pleaded with the authorities to improve leisure facilities in the village. Pete Rourke, sports

at Warwick District Council, said: "Warwick District Council was happy to get on board with this project because Bubbenhall is an integral part of the district and we do what we can to improve the facilities in all areas."
