Gateway update

Since the WDC Planning Committee meeting on the 19th December the campaign group and supporting allies have been continuing with a strong and robust strategy to maintain pressure, inform the councillors and expose the Gateway falsehoods put forward by the developer.

Action has been taken to establish why Toll Bar Island improvements have not yet started and also when they are likely. A cynical person might think this is being delayed to co-ordinate with Gateway!

Your campaign team has spent many many hours combing through DVD transcripts of the "marathon" December Planning Committee meeting, identifying inaccuracies in advice given by Council Officers to questions asked by Planning Committee members. Individual letters have been sent to those councillors, pointing out the incorrect advice they were given on the night.

As an example, Councillor Rhead asked if financial viability was a material concern? The reply offered by the Council's Legal officer was that profitability was not a concern, it was not the Council's concern how

much profit the developer may or may not make!

It is evident that if you were highly cynical you might think this a deliberate false and misleading reply or should you be of a more

generous nature the response a serious mistake. In fact, financial viability to the delivery of a scheme is a very crucial factor and one that the Council have not sought any advice on.

Another claim by the developers - Roxhill, was the number of Jobs created at several of the

developments they have built. They went so far as to claim Tesco at Dirft and Amazon at Swansea were their developments. We have corrected this blatant untruth! None of the quoted developments were Roxhills'. There are many more examples we have acted on them all.

The Independent report is being put together by GL Hearn and we have succeeded in getting many of our points included in the terms of reference.

Some of the Campaign Group leaders (myself, Alan Roe, David Ellwood and David Wintle) along with Alan Yates of CPRE met with Nick Ireland (who leads the report for GL Hearn) on Monday 25th February. Nick explained how GL Hearn understood the brief and how and where they were obtaining information that will form the report's conclusions.

There were some very important points discussed, the main one being that GL Hearn clearly agreed that the search area for alternative sites is far broader than the conclusions formed by Savills on behalf of the developer and this would be material in establishing need.

He went as far as to say the entire "Golden Triangle" (A line drawn from Peterborough to Nottingham to Milton Keynes and back to Peterborough) was in fact a consideration. Nick stated that it was obvious that Blythe Park in Solihull was a serious alternative, as was Rugby Gateway, Mira and Birch Coppice among many others, all of these sites were conveniently excluded by Savills in their report. A great deal of time was spent discussing job numbers.

Regrettably, the Planning Committee did not include financial viability in the terms of reference and it is our contention that without this you

cannot possibly judge if job creation is likely through the attraction of business as we have no way of knowing what rents could be charged.

GL Hearn agreed that without the financial study all they can do is repeat the Lego Shed calculation of so many jobs per sq ft. However there was agreement that this was flawed.

Nick Ireland was somewhat surprised to be informed that Roxhill Developments have no track record in delivering a single development that has resulted in job creation.

The Gateway application was planned to come back before the Committee in March. This has now been postponed, and is likely to come back before the Committee in April. This allows time for all concerned to digest the report from GL Hearn, due the first week of March and make comments.

I and the other Campaign members at the meeting do have faith that GL Hearn will deliver an honest and truthful report. They are a professional organisation that will not allow their reputation to be used for any cover up or advantage to a dubious developer.

Our team plans to meet at the end of March to share our own findings after the reports publishing, from



which we will if required write to the committee with any points that need clarification or greater emphasis.

Our Local MPs have been kept informed and meetings held with Jeremy Wright MP. There is a meeting scheduled with Jeremy Wright for the end of March by Bubbenhall Parish Council.

We do have a few more major blows to land before the next Planning Committee meeting and will make full use in an appropriate manner closer to the time! Stay tuned and thank you for your continued support.

Vacancy on the Parish Council

The Parish Council currently has a vacancy after Cllr Richard Morrison resigned in December. It is hoped that a new Councillor will be co-opted at the meeting in April.

Housing

Stephen Hay, Senior Planner for WDC Policy, Projects &

Conservation presented to the Council his profiling work on villages, looking into the evidence behind categorising and creating village profiles. Currently WDC need to create 12,000 new homes by 2026, of these, 830 units have been allocated for 25 villages.

The Council was shown a map of

the village with four suggested areas for development (i.e. fields landowners are willing to sell). All the areas shown were green field sites with one located in the conservation area.

The Council was asked whether they would support more housing in Bubbenhall. The Chair noted there was a national housing shortage, however the recent Affordable Housing exercise proved residents were not supportive of dwellings they believe not suitable for the village. Also the lack of suitable location due to existing infrastructure problems, such as drainage was a concern. The PC agreed to look at Stephen Hay's further research when complete.

Gateway Zone

The PC wrote to Cllr Illingworth, chairman of the Planning Committee after representatives of the PCs of Bubbenhall and Stoneleigh had a meeting with GL Hearn, regarding concerns over the terms of reference of the new report. The consultants have been asked to respond to the question 'How many jobs are likely to be created by the Gateway development?' In the earlier Savill's report this question was answered merely by reference to the size of the units to be built and their potential job capacities. The PC noted there was a big difference between *likely* and *potential*.

The Gateway application will go to Planning Committee again on 9th or 10th April. The Chair, Cllr Symes and Alan Roe will attend a meeting with Jeremy Wright MP at the end of March.

Precept

The Parish Council agreed the precept for 2013-14 should be £11,000. The Council noted the 9% increase in the band D charge

however given the Gateway crisis, felt that residents will understand.

Planning

Recent applications include:

- Leeming House, 2 Waverley Edge, Leamington Road: Ground floor single storey extension
- Fir Cottage, Weston Lane: Variation of condition No.2 imposed on planning permission W/12/0956 granted on 27th September 2012 for the erection of a two storey side extension and single storey rear extension
- York Barn, Pagets Lane: Use of residential accommodation at The Cart Barn as a separate dwelling independent of York Barn.

Neighbourhood Watch

PCSO Ed King attended the meeting on 5th March to give advice to the Neighbourhood Watch Committee and Parish Council regarding recent increase in incidents in the Village. PCSO King stated that there have been 8 incidents of theft in Bubbenhall over the last year; however the last 4 were in February alone! Foot patrols have been increased from one a week to three and the mobile police station will be at the Village Hall on 7th April 1-1.30pm. PCSO King also mentioned the non-emergency telephone number 101 to use. The Chair thanked Ed for attending the meeting and mentioned how important the Safer Neighbourhood Team email newsletter was for disseminating information and also our own village mailing list, Ed also stated that the SNT is now on Twitter as well!

Village Website

The Parish Council's website was first set up in 2001 designed by the then Clerk Mick Jeffs, who still updates the site despite not living in the village. In January the Parish Council and Village Hall Committee agreed to combine the PC website

and Village Hall website into one website for the village. Jan Lucas has worked on the new site, which is now live (www.bubbenhall.info). The Parish Council thanked Jan and Mick for all their hard work.

Liaison Committee

The Wolston Fields application which includes the importation of 900,000 tonnes of sand and gravel to Bubbenhall quarry is due to go to WCC Regulatory Committee on 4th June 2013.

Smiths have confirmed that the Highways Agency do not want any further traffic using the Toll Bar roundabout and so lorries travelling from Wolston will avoid it. Smiths have stated that lorries will not go through Ryton when travelling from Wolston to Bubbenhall (i.e. fully loaded) however they will on the return journey (when empty). The Parish Council still objects most strongly to this application.

Recreation Ground/ Youth Space Project

Play park will be ordered before the Easter holidays to top up the play areas.

The application for a grant of £14,200 for the Youth Space Project from WDC has been approved. A copy of the notification letter has also been forwarded to WREN and this now completes the application to them for a grant. The WREN awarding body will meet in February to consider the application. Once the WREN grant has been determined it is proposed to facilitate a meeting between the chosen contractors and young people from the village as a step to drawing up the final specification for the new play area.

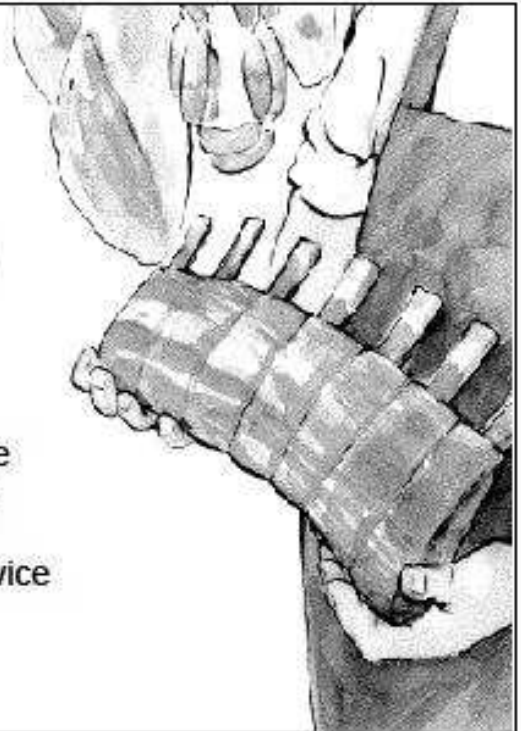

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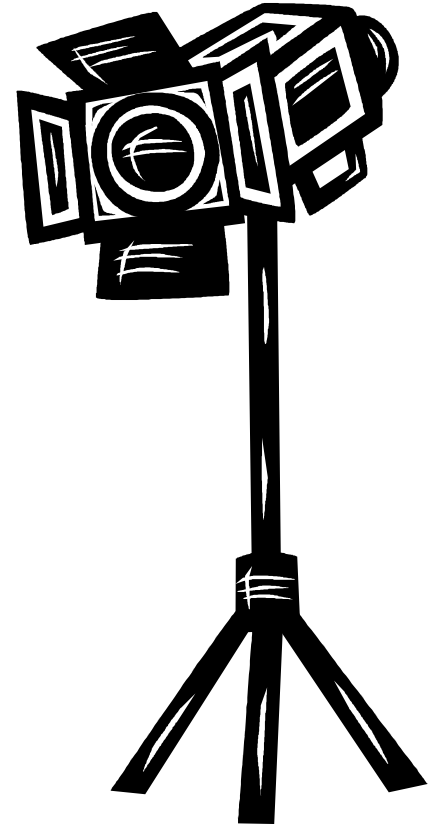

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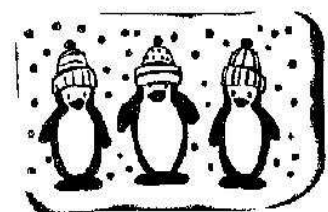
Delivery of local village Christmas cards

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Community First Responders

Background

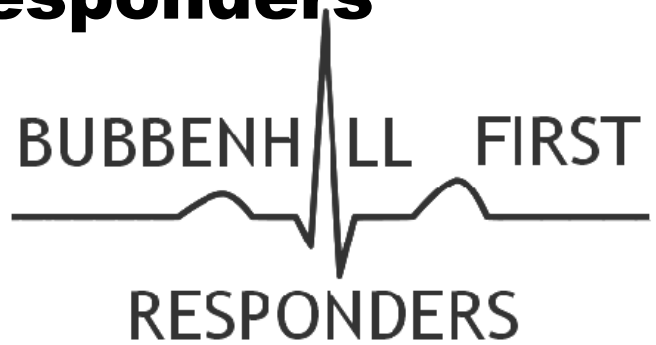
Community First Responder Scheme (CFR) is a national initiative and forms an integrated part of the ambulance service.

Bubbenhall CFR's works under the West Midlands Ambulance Service (WMAS) First Responder Scheme. There are currently around 1,500 Community First Responders working across the West Midlands region who are supported by a WMAS CFR Co-ordinator for Coventry & Warwickshire.

CFRs operate to a strict deployment protocol and operating procedures set by WMAS NHS Trust, CFRs are called out by WMAS to life-threatening, emergency, medical calls within their locality providing vital 'first-person-on-scene' assistance to people who are ill or injured prior to the arrival of the ambulance crew.

What are we trying to do?

We are building a team of Community First Responders who live in Bubbenhall and the surrounding area. We will work in partnership with WMAS which provides the ambulance service in a large portion of the Midlands including Warwickshire. Our volunteers will be trained by WMAS to National Ambulance Standards, (IHCD First Person on Scene) to deal with medical emergencies that are deemed immediately life threatening.



We currently have two volunteers who have completed their theory and practical exams and another two volunteers who will start training in March 2013. This training includes how to use an Automated Defibrillator, a machine that can deliver a potentially lifesaving shock to a patient in cardiac arrest. The training also covers the use of oxygen/airway therapy and basic life support skills. After successful completion of training, volunteers are required to complete two 'ride along' sessions with qualified paramedics before being allowed to go operational.

Why is this project needed?

Government and NHS Guidelines stipulate that a person suffering from a heart attack, stroke etc should be stabilized within 8 minutes for any chance of survival. Research shows that a person will have an 80% chance of survival if stabilized within 2 minutes. However for every minute after the initial 2 minute period the person's chance of survival drops 10% per minute. Nationally 383,000 out of hospital cardiac arrests occur annually with 88% of these arrests occurring at home.

How will the scheme operate?

Community First Responders are primarily called to attend "Category A" emergency calls, these are 999 calls which the West Midlands Ambulance Service deems to be "Serious and/or life threatening" and therefore by their very nature, need medical help to arrive as quickly as

possible, usually within the first 8 minutes from the 999 call being made. "Category A" calls are usually where the patient is suffering from some of the following illnesses or symptoms:

- Cardiac arrest**
- Unconscious and collapsed patients**
- Chest pains (eg heart attacks and acute angina)**
- Breathing difficulties (eg asthma, acute on-set bronchitis/emphysema)**
- Diabetic emergencies (eg hypoglycaemia)**
- Fitting or convulsions (eg epilepsy)**
- Stroke (CVA)**
- Anaphylaxis (allergic reaction)**
- Choking patients**

When operational, WMAS will alert the team if there is a 999-call which needs an urgent response in our coverage area. The anticipated coverage area for this scheme will include the following villages – Bubbenhall, Baginton, Stoneleigh, Weston under Wetherley and Ashow.

The scheme will also be able to provide backup to Ryton. Given the need to reach a casualty in the shortest possible time, in order to maximise the chances of saving life each of our team will carry a full set of response equipment, it is not considered a viable option to store or share this equipment in the village hall or any other central location.



Remember that for every minute spent collecting equipment the chances of survival decrease by 10% once a person has gone in to cardiac arrest.

In time it is hoped that Bubbenhall CFRS will be able to provide 24/7 cover. However this level of cover will require more volunteers to be recruited. In the short term our service objective is to provide cover during periods of high risk as advised by WMAS and the Risk Profile contained within the Bubbenhall Emergency Plan.

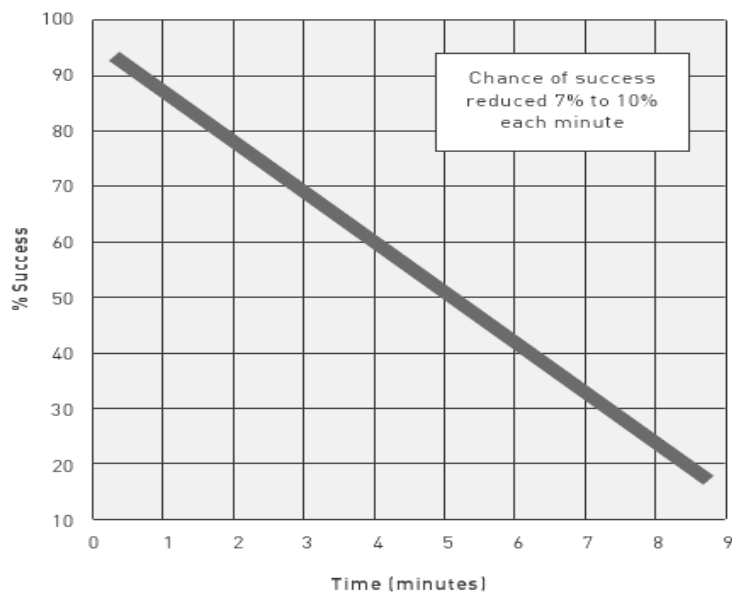
How much will the scheme cost?

As volunteers, the team are committed to giving their time to respond to callouts, train and fundraising free-of-charge. In line with all other CFR Schemes, we will receive no funding from WMAS or the NHS and so we will be totally dependent on fundraising in our own community in order for the scheme to operate.

Based upon the experience of CFR schemes already operating the cost of fully equipping (medical equipment and Personal Protective Equipment) one volunteer is £2,000. Thereafter the annual cost of running the service will be less than £500 per volunteer.

So far BVE have pledged financial support and some residents in the village donated in excess of £200 after their annual Christmas Dinner. In addition we have received some donations from residents within the village and a very successful fundraising event has been held at the Malt Shovel Public House who have nominated us as their Charity of the Year. Bubbenhall and other Parish Councils within the proposed coverage area will be approached for funding.

What Governance arrangements will be put in place?

Bubbenhall CFRs have applied to HMRC for recognition as a charity for tax purposes. In order to ensure open and transparent governance a constitution has been drawn up and a board of trustees has been appointed.

Some 'Myth Busters'

Whilst there are 'Heart Start' schemes in operation locally (Stoneleigh Deer Park Golf Club) the people trained at these locations do not respond outside the Golf Club.

Contrary to popular belief there are not 40 trained CFRs in Ryton and there isn't an AED stored in the village hall; there is only one volunteer CFR operating in Ryton and he keeps the required equipment with him at all times.

The option of storing medical emergency equipment in the village hall or another central location is not a viable option if the scheme wants to meet its vision of saving life.

Neighbourhood Watch

Following the recent spate of crime within the village, the Parish Council and the Bubbenhall Neighbourhood Watch invited our local Police Community Support Officer, Ed King along to the Parish Council meeting so that he could give a joint briefing on any action that we should take.

Ed presented local crime statistics that illustrated how there had been only eight incidents of crime through the period March 2012 to February 2013, but that four of these had occurred during February. He stated that in his view the level of crime in Bubbenhall is generally low, much lower than the surrounding area and that during his recent door to door enquiries following the car theft in Coopers Walk it was evident that the community is aware of the need to look after neighbour's property when they are away, etc.

Knowing that crime levels are low is obviously no consolation to the unfortunate victims that may have their property damaged or stolen, so it is important that we all remain vigilant in keeping our village as safe, secure and as crime free as we can by reporting all incidents and suspicious behaviour to the police. At the meeting Ed King informed us that there is a new non-emergency 101 phone number that can be used across the country. This will connect callers directly to their local police station and is in addition to the usual emergency 999 number.

We have a good Neighbourhood Watch organisation with representatives for every street in the village and with the aid of the communications technology that we have available, as well as the conventional note through the door, we can quickly alert the local community to any criminal events.

There is one part of our village that does not have a Neighbourhood Watch representative, that is the Weston Lane / Waverly Edge area, so if there is anyone prepared to volunteer I would be pleased to hear from them. The task is not a difficult one it is just a matter of communicating the occasional police bulletins so please help if you can.

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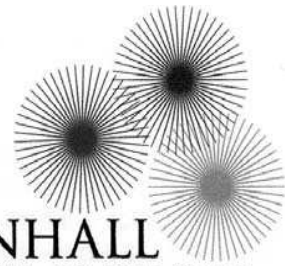

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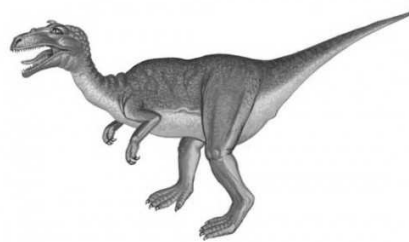
BEG News

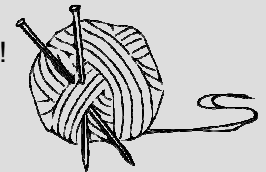
