
Newsletter Committee



Security

The Police continue to report on security matters affecting the village. During the period from June to October, a vehicle was stolen from Lower End during the day, in the full view of residents. The owners were away from the house at the time. On their return, their hire car was substantially damaged whilst parked outside their house.

A sun house was subjected to criminal damage at premises in Lower End, a large quantity of tack was stolen from stables next to Riverside, a satnav was stolen from a vehicle parked in Coopers Walk, and a radio, mobile phone, satnav and DVD player were stolen from a vehicle in Orchard Way. PC Everall reiterated the message that some people are still leaving attractive items in vehicles. The opportunist criminal must not be availed of these opportunities.

Scams

The Police have informed us of further scams and they have asked that the information be given to residents: Email users are warned to be aware of emails that falsely purport to come from eBay, entitled 'invoice' and thanking the recipient for their purchase of a bag. Recipients of the scam email are asked to pay the invoice by clicking on a link in the email. Computer users are urged to delete these emails and not to follow any links they might contain.

Door to door sellers are reported to be trying to sell 'we don't buy at the doorstep' stickers. Free stickers can be obtained from Warwickshire Trading Standards Service.

The latest email scam received by the Trading Standards Service falsely claims to come from HM Treasury. Recipients of the email are told that the Treasury has calculated your tax payments in the last two years. They are then invited to claim a refund by clicking on a link entitled HM Treasury. The link directs the recipient to a suspicious website.

Another scam the Trading Standards Office are making people aware of is a card posted through your door from a company called PDS (Parcel Delivery Service suggesting that they were unable to deliver a parcel and that you need to contact them on 0906 6611911 (a premium rate number). Do not call this number as this is a mail scam originating from Belize. If you call this number you start to hear a recorded message and you will already have been charged £15.00 for the phone call.

Liaison Committee

Planning permission was granted for the revised application by WRG which involves a reduction of the volume of additional waste by over a quarter, compared to that applied for in the original application. The overall height of the site would be reduced by a metre and there would be a commitment to completing landfill within fifteen years (by 2022). The landfill sites nearest the houses (250 metres from the nearest dwelling house) will be dealt with by stripping the top soil, infilling with soil and then putting the top soil back. No landfill waste will be put into these sites.

An email was received by the Clerk at Bubbenhall on the afternoon of 20th August stating that the reapplication would be discussed by the Regulatory Committee of WCC on the following morning. At that late stage it was impossible for any member of Bubbenhall Parish Council to attend the meeting to voice their objections to the application. A letter has been sent from Bubbenhall Parish Council expressing their concern, to Warwickshire County Council

WRG have submitted a tender to WCC to commence inVessel composting at the Bubbenhall site. This would involve 20,000 tons of waste per annum being composted over a fixed period of 15 years. The

composting would take place below ground level in airtight buildings. Concern was expressed that this activity would not cease after 15 years. WCC have asked for tenders for this type of work and WRG are amongst the companies who are tendering for it. If WCC grant the tender to WRG, planning permission will need to be obtained for the relevant buildings etc. Members of the Liaison Committee expressed concern as to the end date of this operation and asked to be kept informed if, and when planning permission is applied for. This inVessel composting would involve green and kitchen waste, with an increase in the amount of vehicles using the site.

Bubbenhall Parish Council expressed their concern as to whether or not the work at the site would end in 2022.

Planning Items

have been reviewed by the Parish Council since the last newsletter. An application was received for alterations of a garage at an apartment in Riverside; one for conversion of residential property at School House to a children's nursery, one for conversion of first floor storage to form bedrooms and one for the erection of extensions with alterations to form additional bedroom accommodation and a new porch at a house in Lower End.

The Parish Council gave no objections to these applications. The Parish Council objected to an application to erect a thirty metre mast and cabin at Coventry Airport. This application was granted by the District Council Planning Department, Cllr Nwachkwu and the Clerk attended a planning training forum given by Warwick District Council.

Recreation Ground

Concern has been raised regarding the drainage of the field and costings are being made of the work required. Cllr. R Green makes weekly checks

on the play equipment and ROSPA The flashing lights on the approach have carried out their annual inspection. We are awaiting their report. The sign regarding dogs on the green has been replaced and the Parish Council has contacted the Dog Warden to see what action can be taken regarding dogs fouling the play areas. Once again, we ask all residents to keep their dogs away from the play areas and football pitches.

The barrier to the car park has now been repaired and the car park will be closed at dusk. A notice to this effect will be erected.

Parish Council News

The Parish Council have agreed to support the Village Spout and Green Committee's actions with regard to the bus shelter. Details of their successes with regard to funding was given and the Chair congratulated Mr Tony Sproul and his committee for their hard work in The following planning applications obtaining the funding which will enable the completion of this phase of the project.

to the village are not working correctly and this has been reported.




The total has therefore reached a fantastic £36,300.

outlet feature. We will use stone which is in keeping with that used around the village.


The Parish Council funding will ensure that we can finish the build around the oak structure of the new bus shelter. This will involve the use of reclaimed roof tiles and bricks from the old Glebe Farm Barns courtesy of Smith's Concrete. It will also provide for a new shelter base (back 1,8m from the kerbside) and for riven stone flooring.

The Parish Council has also agreed to fund the ongoing maintenance of the whole Village Green area.

The National Lottery - Awards for All Programme, will primarily fund the reconstruction and permanent creation of the village "pit" or pond, on Pit Hill.

We aim for this to be a wildlife feature and are working with Middlemarch Environmental to achieve a notable additional component of the wider Village Green.

Veolia Environmental's grant will provide the new natural stone cladding for the Village Oak and for



The Warwickshire Rural Initiative I monies will also contribute to the establishment of the pond and with the provision of pathways and seating on and around the green. Additionally there will be hedgelaying and finally the erection of a permanent oak storyboard, detailing the history of the Village Oak, the original Spout and the Village "Pit".

Of necessity, evident progress to date has been steady rather than spectacular. This has been down to the timeframes involved in such a major fundraising effort and to seeking out, discussing and agreeing on designs in the various feature areas of the project.

Additionally the tracking down and selection of the necessary craftsmen, the ensuring of value for our funders and fitting into the selected partners timeframes, has contributed.

However we now believe that we will have completion of the whole project by Summer next year. The first evident major event - beyond the volunteer clearing of the old undergrowth, the landscaping and the Smith's funded sinking of the borehole - will be the erection of the new bus shelter, which should be completed by this coming Christmas.

It will be important for all of the funders to achieve recognition and publicity for their contribution. We will therefore be planning press releases as each phase is completed, culminating in a ceremony next summer to officially "open" the completed village centrepiece. We will be working to get a well known personality to perform the opening.

The National **Memorial Arboretum** Alrewas - Staffordshire




You will no doubt be aware that the National Memorial Arboretum is only 43 miles north of Bubbenhall.
