Glebe Farm footpath

Rick Chambers from Smith's concrete and Mick George from Mick George Contractors attended the September meeting to give an update on the finishing of the Glebe Farm area. They explained that they were seeking an extension of 2 weeks in order to complete the building- up for the new footpath. Many villagers will have seen that the footpath is now complete, and the topsoil level and seeding will be completed by the end of 2024. It was arranged for some residents to tour the site in October.



Playground

Cllr Baker and the Clerk reported that RoSPA had carried out the annual inspection on 01.10.24. Some maintenance tasks were identified including tightening the fence around the multiplay court and removing moss and weeds from the surface. It was recommended that we move the toddler seat to the position of the junior seat to reduce risk of toddlers walking in front of bigger swings.

Cllr Baker is always alert to mole activity which can make the play area surface unsafe by causing a trip hazard, so if you see any fresh mole hills please let the Parish Council know.

continued to try to resolve the issue of duckweed on the pond. . A local expert has been advising get them under control, and the Friends are looking into introducing some fish and oxygenating plants in the future.

During August WCC Highways came out to discuss the Spring on Pit Hill. Excavations revealed that tree roots and collapsed pipework were preventing excess water draining correctly.

The Friends have been pruning dead and overgrown trees and this work will continue to help keep the whole area tidy.

The Spring pump has not been working correctly so a contractor was appointed to investigate any issues and service the pump. Villagers will be notified once the water is safe to drink as further testing required. Jaguar Land Rover have generously agreed to donate ± 1000 to pay for a new sterilizer and control for the pump which should ensure we can all enjoy Bubbenhall Spring water for many years to come (see p20)..

There has been little news about the proposed "gigafactory" for some time, but it has now been made part of the financially beneficial West Midlands Investment Zone, so this is expected to stimulate some activity on the site before long.

Baginton and Bubbenhall. The intention was to learn more about the Zone and what the airport site being part of it might mean for our two villages, Baginton of course expecting the greater impact.

Mr. Elliott told us that the WMIZ is part of a national government initiative from early 2023 whereby a range of incentives are available to the eight regional Mayoralties to stimulate business investment in specific "cluster" areas. The WMIZ is currently concentrating on two sites in Birmingham and Wolverhampton, together with the Coventry Airport and its adjacent undeveloped Whitley and Segro sites.

The Airport is included, although not formally part of the territory covered by the West Midlands try City Council. Mayoralty, by a discrete agreement between Warwick District

The financial benefits for the wider Zone are focused on the creation of modern activities such as advanced manufacturing, life sciences, and the green, creative, and digital industries, but for the moment the Coventry Airport site has a narrower expectation.

The area has now been named as Coventry & Warwick Giga Park. There is still an assumption that a battery factory will be the key occupant, but there is a wider remit for it to include the supporting supply chain. The battery factory is being promoted by Greenpower Park, the joint venture between Coventry Airport Ltd. and Coven-



Julie's Christmas Recipe



GINGERBREAD LOAF CAKE

Cuts into 12 slices. Prep time 10 mins Cook 50 mins

A multifunctional ginger & honey loaf cake. Enjoy with yoghurt and stewed fruit for a festive brunch, or as a teatime treat with butter

Ingredients:

100g butter, plus extra for the tin100g honey125g dark brown sugar4 tbsp milk½ tsp vanilla extract200g self-raising flour¼ tsp baking powder1 tsp ground ginger1 tsp ground cinnamonLarge pinch of grated nutmeg, cloves & ground allspice1 egg, beaten

Method

Step 1

Heat oven to 180C/ 160C fan/gas 4, butter and line a 900g (2lb) loaf tin Put the honey, butter and sugar in a saucepan and warm over a low heat, stirring occasionally until the butter has melted and sugar has dissolved Remove from the heat and pour in the milk and vanilla and set aside to cool.

Step 2

Sieve the flour into a bowl with the baking powder, spices and a pinch of salt.

Add the egg, then gently fold in the along with the melted butter mix.

Once combined, tip into the prepared tin, place on a baking tray and bake for 40 mins until springy to the touch and skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean.

Leave to cool for 10 mins in the tin, then place on a cooling rack and leave to cool completely.



Mary Long

More recent villagers may not know of Mary Long MBE, but others will remember her delivering the post and being a stalwart of The Malt Shovel Social Club.

Mary Glover was born in Bubbenhall in 1932. She married John Long in 1955 and continued to live in the village. In 1966 she became the village postlady and remained that until she retired (but at well past 60). Besides that she worked in the kitchens of The Malt Shovel. She and John started the village flower show, which is now the Bake-Off and Produce Show, and the Boxing Day Walk and Auction. Through this Mary was important in raising thousands of pounds for Myton Hospice, Warwick.



In 1998 she was awarded the MBE for delivering the post in Bubbenhall for 32 years and for her charity work. She maintained the latter for many years, and every Christmas she also collected food and blankets for the Dogs Trust at Honiley. The Malt Shovel Social Club has continued to raise money for Myton Hospice and Honiley is also still being supported (see p 13).

Having spent all her life in Bubbenhall and giving a lot to the community Mary has moved to a care home in Yorkshire, near her grandchildren.



It has been some time since the iconic Spring on the Village Green has been able to dispense water. Until we had mains water in 1969 spring water via the original Spout was our only formal source of drinking water. This water became increasingly undrinkable due to source contamination.

2009 When In work was completed on restoring the Green, part of the project was to create a wellhead and a 50m borehole to enable the pulling and ,return of fresh, potable spring water to all.

This year we discovered that water was not being extracted and, following investigation by an expert in this field (luckily for us Andy Cassidy is a resident of Bubbenhall) and friend of the Friends of the Village Green group, identified why the pump was not operating correctly. We then had a diagnosis of the problem, and recommendations for resolving it.

We must give thanks to Councillor Alastair Rourke and through him Jaguar Land Rover, who very kindly agreed to cover from their Community Fund the cost of this
