Catchment Area for Secondary Schools

Getting young people from Bubbenhall into their most local school, North Leamington School, has been an ongoing issue for years as entry to the school is based on distance whilst any other factors such as sibling or education and healthcare plans are not part of the equation. County Cllr Edwards has taken up this cause as he recognises this presents a significant challenge to rural communities and their young people. Please let the Parish Council know if you have any views.

Gateway South Country Park

The new Country Park created around the Gateway South logistics development is due to open at Christmas 2025 and will offer 8km of walking. Pedestrian access from the village will currently be by Bubbenhall Bridge.

Discussions continue concerning the feasibility of building a bridge to connect Bubbenhall to the new Country Park, over the River Avon. BPC have acknowledged there are benefits for our village with this scheme but have also raised concerns about potential traffic to gain access to this through the village. Discussions

continue so please let councillors know if you have any views.

Emergency Plan

Cllr Haynes reported that the Brethren have donated a pump for use in flooding situations and the village Emergency Plan has been updated to reflect that. The Parish Council thanks the Brethren community for this donation.

Cosy Café (p14)

Cllr Haynes confirmed that the Cosy Café has reopened from 23rd October 2025 through to April 2026 following the huge success in its first year. A local (Genesis Wealth Creation) sponsorship of £200 has been given to pay the Village Hall rental which is hugely appreciated. The Clerk has submitted an application for funding to WDC. The Parish Council records its thanks to Cllr Haynes and the other volunteers for making this wonderful community project available. Anyone is welcome to attend, and the Cosy Café is open every Thursday from 10am to 12noon.

Spring Hill Road Issues

The leak was finally confirmed as a broken Severn Trent pipe and this has now been fixed. Both Chair Cllr Roberts and our County Cllr Edwards are writing

.to Severn Trent Water to highlight the very slow response to this issue, and the resulting state of the road.

Defibrillators

Cllr Haynes reported that these are fully serviced and ready for use in an emergency medical situation. Villagers are reminded that you do not need special training to use these, the machines have both written and verbal instructions should you ever be called to use one. They are also extremely safe, and cannot shock someone who doesn't need it, so please never hesitate to use one.

The next meeting will be Tuesday 9th December at 7.30pm, and all villagers are welcome to attend to see the work of your Parish Council, and to give any views. Please note there are always refreshments at the December meeting!



Bubbenhall Litter Pick – A Great Village Effort!

On Saturday 25th October, volunteers from across Bubbenhall came together for our community litter pick - a fantastic example of teamwork and village spirit in action.

Armed with litter pickers, high-vis jackets, and plenty of enthusiasm, residents of all ages helped clear the verges, footpaths, and playing fields around the village. Thanks to everyone's efforts, we collected around 15 to 20 bags of litter, helping to make our village cleaner, safer, and more welcoming for everyone.

It was great to see people from every part of the community joining forces, neighbours chatting as they worked, families lending a hand, and new faces getting involved for the first time.

Bubbenhall Survivors

Anyone looking closely at the poppies under the oak tree (see below) will see a name on each one. These are the names of those recorded on the memorial in St Giles Church who died in World War I and II, along with one death from the Boer War on a separate



plaque.

At the time of World War I Bubbenhall was a small, predominantly agricultural, village. We know about who didn't return but how many born and raised in Bubbenhall did military service and

returned.

The baptismal records for St Giles are available on the South Warwickshire Family History website. Using various Family History websites birth and death dates, census data and Military records were checked. Unfortunately, many Military records were damaged by bombing in World War II so not finding one does not mean that a person did not have one.

A small number of men were found who had been baptised at St Giles and lived locally, had undertaken military service and returned. There were three who were related to three of those that died: Joseph Henry Mills, Alfred John Mills and William Elliott.

George and Mary Ann Mills had six sons. The two eldest did not

serve, the middle two Joseph and Alfred returned but the two youngest Walter Robert and Arthur James were killed. Alfred died in 1971.

William Elliott was wounded in 1915. He had been working as a market gardener in Bubbenhall with Eric Mercer, from Coventry, and both had enlisted. William was given exemption from further service to run the market garden. Eric returned alive. William's two brothers Henry John and Percy George died in 1917 and 1918.

The allotment area on the Village Green is maintained by Angela Elliott, William's granddaughter, continuing the market garden influence.



Bubbenhall Wakes

The Wakes used to be held on the first Sunday after St. Giles' Day, 12th September. These ceased during the First World War. They took place on the Green and on Pit Hill and down the main street. There were swingboats on the triangular patch of green which used to exist outside the Manor House in the middle of the village, and roundabouts at the bottom of Pit Hill. An old sword was used by someone who was blindfolded in order to cut at a side of meat. The women used to chase a greased piglet and the one who caught it won it. Local newspapers from the 1860s onwards give a more fulsome account: In 1866, for instance, the Bubbenhall Lodge of the Odd Fellows met at 11.30 am, and, headed by the band of the 2nd Warwickshire Militia, marched down to the parish church, where a sermon was preached by a visiting clergyman. That year the new east window of the church had just been installed, and was much admired. After the church service and headed by the band and the banner of the Lodge, the members marched to the Three Horse Shoes, where the proprietors, Mr. and Mrs. Satchwell, were ready and waiting with a sumptuous dinner. This was accompanied by various loyal toasts. In 1889 the Odd Fellows in Bubbenhall celebrated their 24th anniversary, which suggests that their particular lodge was founded in 1865.


An announcement in the *Midland Daily Telegraph* on 16th September 1912, inserted by William Vincent, the then licensee of The Three Horse Shoes, gives an impression of the numbers of visitors expected in the village during the week, and indeed the place would be crowded with people, from Coventry especially. At the Three Horse Shoes teas and lunches were available, there was a Club Room accommodating 200 people, small and large parties were catered for, and wines, spirits and cigars were on sale, with 'everything of the best supplied'.

In 1936 there was a splendid interview with William Humphries, then 84 years old. He explained that the long since defunct Bubbenhall Wakes had lasted for a whole week and confirmed that they always began on the first Sunday after 12th September. For most of the week the village streets would be filled with swings, coconut shies, stalls, and all sorts of amusements. On Wake Monday the Odd Fellows would have their parade and dinner, usually at the Three Horse Shoes but on occasions at the Malt Shovel. On the Tuesday and Wednesday the holiday would continue, and would include bowling for ladies, the prizes being pieces of dress material. There was dancing, which continued until the early hours, and that in those days the pubs remained open until midnight. Mr. Humphries was living with his widowed daughter, Mrs. Lovell, at Gravel Villa (now Hill Cottage) on the Stoneleigh Road. He died in 1939 at the age of eighty-seven.







Julie's Christmas Recipe

SAUSAGE ROLL WREATH WITH MULLED WINE CRANBERRY RELISH

Serves 12 Prep time: 25 mins



Ingredients:

1 x 500g block puff pastry	1 x 500g pork sausage meat (or use sausages skinned)	
2tbsp finely chopped sage	Plain flour for dusting	1 large beaten egg

For the Relish

1x 250ml jar cranberry sauce	Zest of 1 orange	3 tbsp red wine (or port)
1 cinnamon stick	1 star anise	

Note:

You can make the relish up to 3 days ahead and keep in the fridge. Prepare the wreath up to the end of step 6 a few hours ahead, cover and chill, or freeze for up to 1 month. Bake from frozen, for 55 minutes.

Method:

1. Reserve 4 tablespoons of cranberry sauce for later, then put the rest into a small pan with the remaining relish ingredients. Bring to a simmer and cook for 2-3 minutes, leave to cool. Remove the pastry from the fridge about 10 minutes before you need to roll it.
2. Mix the sausage meat well with the sage, add some salt & pepper. Preheat the oven to 200°C, fan180°C, gas6
3. On a floured surface, roll the pastry to a long rectangle, about 30cm x 45 cm. Spread the reserved cranberry sauce lengthways down the middle of the pastry, in a line about 5cm wide. Mould the sausage meat into a long log and lay it on top of the cranberry sauce.
4. Use the beaten egg to brush down one side of the pastry. Fold the other side over the meat then the egg washed over this to seal. Turn over so that the seal is at the bottom to look like a giant sausage roll. Transfer to a baking sheet lined with baking paper.
5. Cut two-thirds of the way through the sausage roll every 3.4-4cm, to make 10-12 sections, then join the two ends (uncut side in the middle) together with a little more egg wash, to form a wreath.
6. Gently twist each piece of sausage roll over, without tearing it from the main body, so it is filling side up. Brush any exposed pastry with the remaining egg wash.
7. Bake for 40-50 minutes until the pastry is golden and puffed, and the sausage meat is cooked through.
8. Serve with the relish in a small bowl in the centre for dipping. Decorate with herbs for presentation if using.

Book 3 in the series: Windows on Bubbenhall

A History of St. Giles' Church Bubbenhall

This exciting new release is about to launch, showcasing a lifetime of research and discovery by historian Victoria Airey, who grew up next to the church from 1945 to 1958. Vicky has enlarged her earlier church history, which is now richly illustrated. It also reveals much about the village itself and the people of the past.



A special service in the Church of Sunday 26th October saw the launch of a new *History of St Giles' Church Bubbenhall* authored by Vicky Airey. That event included an introductory talk by Vicky herself and a second by Professor Fraser Watts: a keen student of British churches.

Vicky spent many of her early years living in Church Road Bubbenhall. As an enthusiastic archivist she has devoted many years to research the origins and later history of our 900 year old Church just a few yards from where she once lived. This has included work in the archives of both Lichfield and Worcester Cathedrals that formerly held responsibility for the church in Bubbenhall. She published a book on the same topic in 1979: her new book published this October is a full rewrite and update.
